# INSTRUCTORS FOR DHS ACQUISITION WORKFORCE CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS FOR PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

#### 1.0 GENERAL.

#### 1.1 SCOPE.

To provide instructors for HSAC 101 – Homeland Security Fundamentals of Acquisition and HSPM 102 - Homeland Security Fundamentals of Program Management courses. Future requirements will include instructors for HSAC 201 – Homeland Security Intermediate Principles of Acquisition Management, HSPM 250 - Homeland Security Acquisition Tools for Program Management Systems and HSPM 350 Homeland Security Advanced Program Management Office courses.

#### 1.2 BACKGROUND.

The Department of Homeland Security, Office of the Chief Procurement Officer, Acquisition Workforce Branch is responsible for providing career development training for the entire DHS acquisition workforce. DHS's acquisition work force is expanding dramatically and with that, there is a significant increase in training requirements. DHS requires additional acquisition course offerings to increase the number of students completing certification requirements to fill operational positions within the DHS headquarters and Components. These courses have been developed and DHS is procuring instructors to deliver additional offerings of these courses.

#### 1.3 CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL.

The contractor shall provide the Government Contracting Officers Technical Representative (COTR) the name, telephone number, and email of the contractor's point of contact for the course offering. This person must be able to answer questions about course materials, instructor name, start times, directions to the classroom location (if provided by Offeror) etc.

### 1.4 HOURS OF OPERATION.

Contractor employees working at Government facilities or at government provided training locations shall generally perform all work between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday (except Federal holidays). However, there may be occasions when Contractor employees shall be required to work other than normal business hours, including weekends and holidays, to fulfill requirements under this contract.

#### 1.5 GOVERNMENT FURNISHED RESOURCES

The Government will provide all instructor course materials and all student materials including student texts, survey forms and certificates.

The government will provide a suitable classroom facility for up to 35 students which will be handicap accessible. Classrooms will be equipped with audio-visual systems for course presentation including internet access if required. Classrooms shall be configured for five (5) student workgroups of up to seven (7) students each or as directed by the COTR and Contractor. Each workgroup shall be configured to facilitate both course presentation and individual small group exercises. Each workgroup shall be provided standard paper/easels or whiteboards with associated writing materials. Classroom facilities will be within close proximity of break areas and restroom facilities within the same building complex of the classroom location. Classroom facilities within the Washington DC metropolitan area will be accessible by Metro Rail with no additional transfers required. The Metro Rail stop closest to the classroom location will be no more than one-quarter mile walk to the classroom facility.

#### 2.0 CONTRACTOR FURNISHED PROPERTY.

Instructors shall meet the standard qualifications set forth by the Contractor to meet the experience level of the course material and field experience requirements. The Instructors must be expert acquisition program management professionals and possess thorough knowledge and understanding of federal government contracting and acquisition processes, practices, and procedures.

The government anticipates providing the facilities for each of the classes, however in the event that government-provided facilities are not available, the COTR shall communicate directly with the Contractor Point of Contact (POC) no later than 30 days prior to the class offering to make arrangements for the POC to provide the location and estimated cost of an alternate facility.

#### 3.0 REQUIREMENTS.

3.1 The objective of this contract is to obtain qualified instructors for the Program Management course offerings listed below and the corresponding class schedule provided in Attachment I. Additional quantities of the same courses in this contract may be provided as agreed to between the Contractor and COTR. Prices for additional courses for both local Washington DC and other CONUS course locations will be requested from the Contracting Officer.

Each HSAC 101, HSPM 102, HSAC 201, and HSPM 250 class shall be one week (40 hours) of classroom instruction. HSPM350B class shall be four weeks (160 hours) in length. Each class shall require two (2) instructors per session to provide a team teaching format.

HSAC 101 - Homeland Security Acquisition Fundamentals

HSPM 102 - Homeland Security Program Management Fundamentals

HSAC 201B - Homeland Security Intermediate Principles of Acquisition Management

HSPM 250 - Homeland Security Acquisition Tools for Program Management Systems

HSPM 350B - Homeland Security Advanced Program Management

The Contractor shall instruct up to 35 students in each class using the course materials and student texts provided by the government and supplemented with Contractor provided instructional aids. The Contractor shall instruct the class in a manner conducive to adult learning and accommodate a reasonable spectrum of learning styles. The Contractor shall accommodate students with physical disabilities within the instruction method. At the beginning of each class the contractor shall provide the Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) a class roster of student names attending the class. The contractor shall maintain a record of student attendance and provide this record at the end of the 1st class day to the COTR along with the student locator card information.

3.2 At the end of each class, the Contractor shall encourage each student to complete an anonymous survey. All surveys will be collected by the COTR at the completion of each class.

#### 4.0 DELIVERABLES.

#### 5.0 KEY PERSONNEL.

The contractor shall include among the personnel to be assigned to perform under this contract at least one person as a Lead Instructor. These person/persons shall be considered essential to the work described herein and must be full-time dedicated to this effort. All individuals proposed for the work under this contract must be the actual individuals who will perform the work and shall meet the qualifications described in Volume 1 of the Technical Proposal and shall require approval from the Contracting Officer or COTR prior to conducting any classroom instruction.
