Q: Does a transit agency require a partnership with another entity?

A: No, a transit agency with an FTA Recipient ID is eligible to apply directly without any partners. However, FTA encourages partnerships for research proposals.



Q: Which buses are eligible for this grant program?

A: Bus for this grant program is defined as "a rubbertired, low-floor transit passenger vehicle, 35 feet or longer in length, and is self-powered."



Q: What are the evaluation criteria for the projects?

A: The NOFO provides detailed application review criteria under section E.

Q: Will FTA consider any proposals that address the collision and mitigation area focused on rail transit rather than bus transit?

A: The proposers can apply for either bus or rail operation. However, FTA is more interested in bus collision avoidance and mitigation proposals.



Q: Will FTA consider two separate projects from the same transit agency that are phased so that the total is greater than \$2 million (\$2 million per separate project phases)?

A: An agency or entity can submit as many project applications as necessary, but it is our preference to receive one project per application.



Q: Is there a maximum percentage of capital funding you can request?

A: This is a not a capital funding program but a research program. The minimum project amount is \$750,000 and maximum project amount is \$2,000,000 of federal funding. The grant program requires 20% cost share.



Q: Do you anticipate another round of the Safety Research and Demonstration Program?

A: We anticipate future funding for the SRD program, pending on future appropriations. However, the safety topic(s) and focus might change.

A: Project proposals must be submitted via grants.gov by
