

Background

2015 Transit Advisory Committee for Safety (TRACS) Report, Preventing and Mitigating Transit Worker Assaults in the Bus and Rail Industry

- Identified causes of assault against transit workers
- Reviewed strategies to mitigate these assaults

Section 3022 of the FAST Act requires an notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) on protecting public transportation operators from assault no later than March 2017

Discussion Topics


- How should we define assault?




