Position Description: This position is Flight Chief of an operations flight in an expeditionary communications squadron. Incumbent will lead, direct and manage Airmen who provide rapidly deployable communication and information systems to the joint warfighter. Manage the training, readiness, and career progression of approximately 65 traditional Air National Guard (ANG) members in five specialties. Supervise three full time ANG members. Direct activities for installing, operating, maintaining, inspecting, modifying, repairing, and deploying cyberspace systems and equipment platforms that may include voice, data, video, cryptographic, network infrastructure, radio, satellite, intrusion detection, and telemetry. Ensure delivery of mission critical information and cyber services in various settings to include garrison, training environments, field training exercises, readiness evaluations, and contingency deployments. Manage and direct network operations in garrison and deployed locations by performing duties to develop, sustain and enhance network and electromagnetic capabilities. Execute operational plans to ensure positive control of assigned forces. Coordinate with coalition forces, DOD agencies, and other service providers. Establish training requirements and training programs to meet knowledge and certification requirements. Coordinate with other agencies to acquire additional training resources as needed. Develop budget input to ensure resource availability for operational requirements. Assist in the planning, scheduling and work flow of Unit Training Assemblies and Annual Training. Implement and interpret policies, directives and procedures. Manage squadron programs as assigned. Must be worldwide deployable without restrictions or waivers. Joint communications experience and prior deployments to joint environment highly desirable. Other duties as required.

Length of Tour: IAW ANGI 36-101, paragraph 6.2.1., Initial tours will not exceed 6 years. Initial tours will have a Probationary Period of 3 years. Follow-on tour will not exceed six years and will not be extended beyond an enlisted Airman's Expiration Term of Service (ETS) or an Officer's Mandatory Separation date (MSD).

Appointment: The publication of AGR orders by HRO will be the official appointment into the Florida Air AGR program. **No commitment** will be made by the command to any applicant prior to the review of qualifications by the HRO and TAG approved appointment through the Officer Action Board (if applicable).

MINIMUM QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Individuals must meet Physical Fitness Standards. Applicants must provide a printed copy of the electronic Air Force Fitness Assessment Results dated within the past 12 months of application close date, reference AFI36-2905.
2. Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve or the United States Air Force members who have not achieved a passing Fitness Program score are ineligible for entry into the AGR Program.
3. Air National Guard members must meet the physical qualifications outlined in AFI48-123. Medical exams must be conducted not more than 12 months prior to entry on AGR duty.
4. An applicant on a medical profile, to include pregnancy, may apply and be selected for an AGR tour; however, the selectee may not begin the AGR active duty tour until the medical restrictions are released.
5. Must meet any Special Requirements as specified on Position Description.
6. Failure to obtain and maintain a **TOP SECRET** security clearance will result in removal from the AGR program.
7. Selected individual must extend/re-enlist for a period equal to or greater than initial tour end date.
8. You must be in a military status to apply for an AGR position.

9. Enlisted applicant's military grade cannot exceed the maximum military grade authorized. Over grade enlisted applicant must indicate, in writing, the willingness to be administratively reduced in grade when assigned to the position. Officers may not enter into the AGR program in an over grade status.
10. IAW ANGI 36-101, paragraph 5.7, an individual must not have been previously separated for cause from active duty or previous Reserve Component AGR tour.
11. IAW ANGI 36-101, paragraph 5.10, applicants should be able to complete 20 years of active federal service prior to Mandatory Separation Date (MSD). Individuals selected for AGR tours that cannot attain 20 years of active federal service prior to reaching mandatory separation must complete a Statement of Understanding contained in Attachment 3 of ANGI36-101.
12. IAW ANGI36-101, paragraph 6.6.1., members should remain in the position to which initially assigned for a minimum of 24 months. TAG may waive this requirement to 18 months when in the best interest of the unit, State, or Air National Guard.
13. Candidates will be evaluated on the basis of their education, experience, training, and performance. Consideration will be based on available information contained in the individual's application.
14. IAW ANGI36-101, paragraph 4.1.6.3, applicants for E-8 positions must have the ability to complete the Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy within 36 months of assignment.
15. Only Enlisted Airmen currently serving in a Fulltime AGR status within the state of Florida may be selected for a vacant UMD AGR position without the awarded duty AFSC and are subject to retraining restrictions.

Applications must be received before the Close of Business (COB) on the closing date to be processed.

1. **NGB Form 34 -1** - ONE signed original (Application for Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Position). Ensure an explanation is attached for required answers given in Section IV.
2. Current **Report of Individual Personnel (RIP)**: Obtained from Virtual Military Personnel Flight (VMPPF) It is your responsibility to ensure your vMPPF Personnel RIP is in order prior to application submittal. This includes but not limited to, verifying Duty History, AFSC, Service Dates.
3. **Must show ASVAB Test Scores and awarded AFSC(s).**
4. **AF Form 422** - Must be obtained from Medical Group. Must be dated within the last 12 months. All applicants **MUST** submit this form whether you are on a profile or not. No other form will be accepted. No exception to policy for this requirement.
5. **Air Force Fitness Management System (AFFMS)** – Current passing (test within last 12 months) official printout from AFFMS database showing a score of 75 or higher.
6. Any missing requirements will result in disqualification. Submittals of any missing requirements after the closeout will NOT be accepted.
7. Include your **e-mail address** on the NGB Form 34-1 (handwrite on top of form)
8. Applicants who are in a higher grade than the grade for this advertisement must provide a statement of understanding with your application stating you are willing to be voluntarily demoted without prejudice if selected for this position, IAW ANGI 36-2503, Paragraph 3.8.
