- No one takes credit alone it's all about the team. Many working on a problem are better than just one. Know your job and the man's next to you; our lives depend on it. You are encouraged to share your ideas.
- Our <u>highest priority</u> preparing combat ready, task organized CS/CSS formations ready for deployment in support of I MEF. "Whatever it takes" will be our "motto."
- Mission First –Marines and Sailors always.
- □ *NCO leadership* is the bedrock of the Corps.
- Accountability. Accountable means to be responsible. To be responsible means you <u>as a leader are liable</u> to be called to account as the primary cause, motive or agent of the success or failure both on and off duty.
- □ Weapons and Equipment accountability is everything. Take care of the tools of our trade. I believe every Marine is a rifleman be proficient with your assigned weapon.
- Complacency kills nothing we do is too benign that it can't be reviewed and remediated.
- □ <u>Deadlines are for people who need reminders</u>. Be decisive stupid or brilliant, you'll learn from it. The unwise make the same mistake twice.
- <u>Leaders manage risk</u>. Safety is a cornerstone of everything we undertake ORM is a tool, use it. NCOs are the backbone of ORM.
- Don't just know the <u>Marine Corps values</u>, live them and demonstrate. <u>Equal Opportunity</u> is just a contemporary way of restating the Golden Rule: *Treat others the way you would like to be treated*. Live this every day.
- Don't allow me/you to be surprised by anything that has taken place in the MLG or your unit.
- Our standards haven't changed. <u>Self-discipline leads to unit discipline</u>. Substance abuse, spousal abuse, sexual assault and moral turpitude will not be tolerated. Treat each other with respect <u>hazing or harassment will not be tolerated!</u>
