## MEMORANDUM FOR CIVILIAN APPLICANTS FOR GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

SUBJECT: Administrative Eligibility Criteria for Exception to Policy (ETP) Consideration

- 1. The Air Force accepts civilian (non-obligated) applicants for consideration by the annual Joint Service Graduated Medical Education Selection Board (JSGMESB). However, civilian applicants are approved to meet the selection board by ETP. The following administrative requirements <u>must</u> be met to be considered for the ETP:
  - US citizen (civilians holding dual citizenship are ineligible)
  - Successful completion of MD/DO degree within 3 years
  - Successful completion of USMLE/COMLEX Steps 1 and 2
  - Successful completion of USMLE/COMLEX Step 3, if a PGY-1 year has already been completed
  - Valid US state license, if a PGY-1 year has already been completed
  - No academic adverse actions/extension/termination during GME training (if applicable)
  - Not obligated to an active/reserve component of the Armed Forces
  - Not obligated as an intern/resident or fellow to a civilian GME program
  - An active duty training location must be available for the desired residency/fellowship
  - Additional requirements for international medical graduates (IMG)
    - o Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) certified
    - O Successful completion of ACGME accredited PG-1 in US or Puerto Rico
    - o Successful completion of USMLE/COMLEX Step 3
    - o Valid US state license
- 2. If <u>all</u> of the above conditions are met, please email CV, Dean's letter, final medical school transcript, Program Director (PD) letter, USMLE/COMLEX scores, copy of state license (if applicable) and a one page letter requesting the ETP and identifying the specialty for which you want to be considered. IMGs must also provide an ECFMG certificate and a letter from the PD verifying that you have successfully completed a PGY-l year in an ACGME accredited program.
- 3. Once all the administrative requirements have been met, ETP approval/disapproval is granted by the Chief of Physician Education Branch. In the event the ETP is approved, further instructions regarding submission of a GME application to the next scheduled JSGMESB will be provided.
