Family support shall be provided to HMHT-302 Marines and Sailors (regardless of marital status), spouses, children, and their designated parents/extended family members. Family readiness allows Marines and their families to balance life, career, and mission-related events.

The Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program (UPFRP) allows me to ensure our command is mission-ready on all fronts; as your Commander, I take personal ownership in our squadron's UPFRP. I am supported in the program's implementation with the help of our Command Team which includes our SgtMaj, Executive Officer, and Family Readiness Officer (FRO). I personally consider our family resiliency and readiness to be equally as important as individual and equipment readiness. Our squadron will be better prepared to respond to whatever challenges the future may bring our way with well informed and fully supported families.
