Narrative Description:

Description of the Incident:

Gretta was flying from Austin, TX to Cleveland, OH. Upon connecting in Houston (IAH), the PetSafe agent noticed that Gretta was in distress. She was immediately pulled from the flight line and was rushed to a nearby Animal Emergency Clinic for emergency treatment. Unfortunately, Gretta was deceased upon arrival at the clinic approximately 20 minutes after arriving into Houston.

Description of the Cause of the Incident:

A necropsy was performed by the Veterinarian at the Emergency Animal Clinic, and he reported that Gretta suffered a Gastric Volvulus, more commonly known as "Gastric Torsion" which is indicative of a condition unrelated to air transit.

Description of any corrective action taken:

All Continental policies were followed, and Gretta's condition could not be anticipated and was unrelated to air travel, so no corrective action is necessary.

Narrative Description:

Description of the Incident:

Midget was flying from Boston to Atlanta. She was observed by the PetSafe agent in Newark when she made her connecting flight and appeared to be normal. However, upon arrival of flight 1151 into Atlanta a few hours later, she was found deceased inside her kennel.

Description of the Cause of the Incident:

A necropsy was performed and no abnormalities were noted and the Veterinarian noted that there was no definitive diagnosis.

Description of any corrective action taken:

After a thorough investigation, it was determined that there were no mechanical problems with the aircraft, and all Continental procedures were followed. Ambient temperatures were between 50-60 degrees throughout the journey, so heat did not play a role. Midget appears to have died of natural causes. Death was not related to Continental's handling or transit, so no corrective action was necessary.

Description of Incident:	Cat escaped from its kennel through door.
Cause of the Incident:	<p>Door was closed but not latched.</p> <p>Passenger originated in Okinawa, Japan with 11 pet cats. Upon arrival into DTW, all 11 cats were brought on cart for Ms. Holm to clear US Customs. Ms. Holm opened the kennel of several cats, including Mickey, to comfort the animals. One of the cats attacked Ms. Holm, scratching her face/neck. Airport paramedics treated her injuries. Passenger was later treated at hospital. Customs and Border Protection agents recaptured the cat that inflicted injury to owner.</p> <p>After US Custom’s cleared Ms. Holm and the cats, NW personnel loaded the cats into NW’s Priority Pet van for transfer. While filling the water trays of the kennels, NW employee witnessed but was unable to prevent “Mickey” squeeze out the corner of kennel door. Cat jumped out of van and ran into bag room. A search remains active for the cat.</p>
Corrective Action Taken:	Reminder to airports to verify doors are secure before acceptance.

Description of incident:

Passenger checked a cat in a kennel on Flight 432 from Chicago (ORD) to Charlotte (CLT). The kennel after going through the normal security checks, was boarded on a tractor cart to be transported from the bag holding area to the departure gate. The kennel door appeared to be locked when it was checked by passenger so we are unclear how the cat got out of the kennel while enroute to the aircraft. The cat jumped from the cart and was struck by a tractor traveling in the opposite direction. The kennel was in good shape with no evidence of damage. All procedures had been met.

Description of cause of the incident:

Description of any corrective action taken:

No corrective action was taken or warranted as United procedures were followed.
