SUBJECT: Procedure Memorandum 18 – Countywide News Releases

Background: During the processing of a new or revised Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), a news release is prepared for each community for the purpose of proposing new or revised 1% annual chance (100-year) flood elevations. The news release is critical in the initiation of the statutory 90-day appeals process.

Issue: Current protocols call for a separate news release to be prepared and published for each community affected by the new or revised elevations. When a revised or newly studied stream passes through several communities within a countywide format FIRM, each news release must include a listing for the subject stream, and must list only the new or revised flood elevations affecting the community. This necessitates that multiple news releases be prepared for each Countywide FIRM and that each stream be listed with customized community-specific elevation information.

In addition, the process of piecing together several single-jurisdiction FIRMs into one seamless Countywide format FIRM often requires that adjustments be made to flood elevations throughout the county to achieve continuity between jurisdictions. These flood elevation adjustments often necessitate multiple news release entries for individual streams in the county.

Action Taken: News Releases for communities sharing a countywide format FIRM will henceforth be processed as a single Countywide News Release. This news release will then be published in the local newspaper(s) to initiate the 90-day appeals period. The countywide news release will provide a listing for each stream that has new or revised

BFEs being proposed at any location within the subject county, and will include a column to indicate the communities affected by the new or revised flood elevations.

New Procedure: The MCC is directed to prepare a countywide format news release to include listings for all new or revised 100-year flood elevations being added or changed at any location within the subject county.

There are four distinct situations that will necessitate a news release entry for a stream in a countywide format FIRM. These situations are as follows:

1. The subject stream has either been restudied or is newly studied within the county.
2. The subject stream is studied in detail in adjacent communities within the county, but the former community-based FIRMs do not exhibit a seamless match of flood elevations across community boundaries. In this situation, one of the two mismatched data sets will be adjusted to agree with the one that is considered to be the most recent and accurate. The revised elevations will be listed on the countywide news release and the affected jurisdictions will be noted appropriately.
3. The subject stream has been studied in detail in one community but has either not been studied or has been studied by approximate methods (Zone A) in an adjacent community. The former Zone A floodplain will be converted to a detailed Zone AE with BFEs, thereby necessitating a news release entry.
4. The floodplain for a detailed study stream has been extended into an adjacent community to achieve a seamless match across jurisdiction boundaries. This scenario may occur even if the subject stream does not physically lie in the affected jurisdiction, but its' associated floodplain extends across jurisdiction boundaries.

Proposed Flood Elevation Determinations for Flood County and Incorporated Areas, Florida

AGENCY: Federal Emergency Management Agency

ACTION: Proposed rule.

SUMMARY:

Technical information or comments are solicited on the proposed modified base (1% annual chance) flood elevations shown in the preliminary Flood Insurance Studies and Flood Insurance Rate Maps for the communities listed in the table below. The base flood elevations are the basis for the floodplain management measures that each community is required to either adopt or show evidence of being already in effect in order to qualify or remain qualified for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

DATES:

The period for comment will be ninety (90) days following the second publication of these proposed rules in a newspaper of local circulation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

The Federal Emergency Management Agency gives notice of the proposed determinations of base flood elevations, in accordance with Section 110 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-234), 87 Stat. 980, which added Section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (Pub. L. 90-448)), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR 67.4(a).

These elevations, together with the floodplain management measures required by Section 60.3 of the program regulations, are the minimum that are required. They should not be construed to mean the community must change any existing ordinances that are more stringent in their floodplain management requirements. The community may at any time enact stricter requirements on its own, or pursuant to policies established by other Federal, State, or regional entities. These proposed modified elevations will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for the new buildings and their contents and for the second layer of insurance on existing buildings and their contents.

Pursuant to the provisions of 5 USC 605(b), the Administrator, to whom authority has been delegated by the Director, Federal Emergency Management Agency, hereby certifies that the proposed modified flood elevation determinations, if promulgated, will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. A flood elevation determination under Section 1363 forms the basis for new local ordinances, which, if adopted by a local community, will govern future construction within the floodplain area. The elevation determinations, however, impose no restriction unless and until the local community voluntarily adopts floodplain ordinances in accord with these elevations. Even if ordinances are adopted in compliance with Federal standards, the elevations prescribe how high to build in the floodplain and do not prohibit development. Thus, this action only forms the basis for future local actions. It imposes no new requirement; of itself it has no economic impact.

Lessees and owners of real property in the following communities, are encouraged to review the preliminary Flood Insurance Studies and Flood Insurance Rate Maps and to submit comments to the appropriate community representatives as listed below. Proposed base flood elevations along flood sources studied in detail are shown on the flood profiles in the study. The proposed modified base flood elevations are as follows:
