Major James Rowlett III is the commander of the Louisville Military Entrance Processing Station.

Major Rowlett enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve in June 1999, and served as a military police officer, Military Police Company B, Force Service Support Group, 4th Marine Corps Logistics Group, New Orleans, Louisiana. He completed Officer Candidate School in Quantico, Virginia and received his commission. Major Rowlett's assignments include ground support equipment division officer-in-charge and airframes officer-in-charge, Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 31, Beaufort, South Carolina; maintenance and material control officer, Marine All-Weather Fighter Attack Squadron 533, Beaufort, and deployed to Iraq; logistics capabilities analyst, Total Force Structure Division, Marine Corps Combat Development Command; action officer, Organization of Marine Corps Forces, Force Structure Review Group, Quantico; aircraft maintenance officer and department head, Marine Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Squadron 3, Marine Air Ground Combat Center, Twentynine Palms, California; and logistics education programs branch head and aviation logistics curriculum developer, Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center, Marine Corps Logistics Operations Group, Doctrine and Integration Division, Twentynine Palms.
