Commander Nicasio earned a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies and Economics from the University of Louisville, Kentucky, and worked in advertising and marketing for a Fortune 500 company in New York City, before receiving her commission through Navy Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island.

Her assignments include first division deck officer and main propulsion division officer aboard the Austin-class amphibious transport dock, USS Denver, homeported in Sasebo, Japan; second division officer deck officer, and computers systems division officer, Combat Systems, aboard the USS Dwight D.
