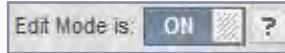


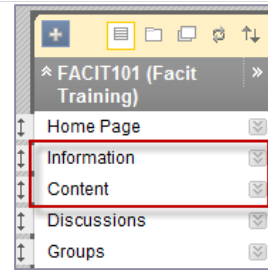


How to Add an Image

Step 1 Make sure the **Edit Mode** is **ON**

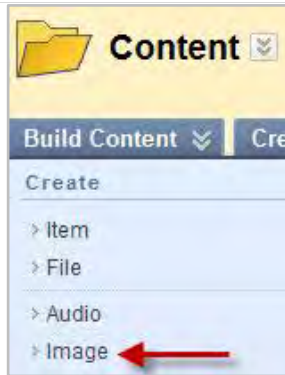


Step 2 Open a **content area** by clicking on it in the course menu




Step 3 Hover your mouse over the **Build Content** menu, and then click **Image** from the menu.



Step 4 **Select Image File Area:**

- **Find File:** Click the **Browse My Computer** button. Look for the image file on your computer or other storage device. Select the **image file** and **Open** to upload your image. (Click the **Select a Different File** button to change the image file.)
- **Name:** Type the **title** of the image.
- **Color of Name:** Choose a preferred color for the title of the image link.
- **Alt Text:** Type a short image description.
- **Long Description:** Type a Long Description of the image.

For custom you can adjust the Set Width and the Set Height fields. • Border: Select Border options for the line thickness. • Image Target URL: Type the name of a URL or web address that will open when users click on the image. • Open Target in New Window: Set to launch your image in new browser window. 	 <p>2. Notes:

- Alt Text allows screen readers to “read” the image description.
- It is better to adjust the height and width of the image prior to adding to your course.
- Common web page compatible images include: .jpeg, .jpg, .gif, .png
- When typing the name of the image, you can omit the file extension.
