We are pleased to announce the first *International Conference on Entrepreneurship & Family Business (ICEFB)*, sponsored jointly by IIT-Bombay, Shailesh J. Mehta School of Management, India and the University of North Texas, College of Business, USA.

The focus of the conference is on entrepreneurship and family business, as practiced and researched by the scholarly community. The magnitude of family business enterprises in existence today, and the emergence of entrepreneurship worldwide, represent two exciting phenomena that are gaining increasing attention in academic and business circles. Interestingly, India, an emerging economy, has risen to the forefront of these phenomena, with successful entrepreneurs and family business owners leading numerous small-scale and multinational enterprises. Some of these entrepreneurial ventures have gone public, and on to the world stage, getting listed on the New York Stock Exchange and other reputed stock exchanges.

Researchers have demonstrated that entrepreneurial activity is closely linked to sustainable growth at the macro (national) level, and at the micro (organizational) level. In a global era of technological advancement, utilizing the creativity of people (talent) and applying multifaceted strategies innovatively are the keys to successful organizations. By creating and emphasizing an entrepreneurial society and culture, many nations have transformed their economies. Likewise, new corporate houses have emerged as dominant global players through the application of strategies that espouse entrepreneurial management and world-class leadership.

It is especially noteworthy to see a significant contribution to national development arise from small/medium enterprises (SMEs), and new ventures, with many of them being family-owned businesses. In fact, there are multiple instances where SMEs have successfully challenged the established entities. These firms offer unique and innovative products/services, or delivery options, that afford improved economic and social value. Social entrepreneurship, in particular, has been instrumental in improving the quality of life for the underprivileged, and enhancing the wellbeing of all.

Other recent developments include the reduced dependency on funding from traditional sources, and the welcoming of practical business ideas for investment. In addition, the increased involvement of women in entrepreneurship and family-owned businesses, has helped shape the business landscape, especially in developing nations.

Against this background, ICEFB offer a platform for open and insightful dialogue on the issues highlighted above. We hope the participants at the conference will explore, expound on, and extend the rich heritage of research on entrepreneurship and family business. The conference will host a mix of academic professionals, institutional policy makers, business leaders and practitioners. We expect to witness vibrant scholarly sessions underscored by a profusion of thought-provoking ideas.

Submissions will be blind-reviewed. <u>Authors given a conditional acceptance decision are required to submit full papers and complete registration by the specified deadlines.</u> Full acceptance decisions are communicated in September.
