TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Using systems theory as an organizing perspective, this course provides an integrated look at the bio-psycho-social factors influencing human development. Cultural factors affecting human functioning, as well as implications for social work practice are explored.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Human Behavior in the Social Environment I in the fall of 2014. Using systems theory as an organizing perspective, this course provides an integrated look at the bio-psycho-social factors influencing human development. Cultural factors affecting human functioning, as well as implications for social work practice are explored.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Field Placement II in the spring of 2014. The primary purposes of this course are: 1) to enable the student to experience and understand the impact of agency structure and policy, client expectations and needs, and community resources on social work practice; and, 2) to teach the student how to appropriately apply social work theory, skills, and techniques in delivery of service to clients. Field Placement II continues where Field Placement I left off in emphasizing generalist social work practice at the micro, mezzo, and macro levels. In addition to covering social work practice objectives, this course will also address professional and career development issues.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Service Learning in the fall of 2013. This course is designed to expose students to a variety of challenges facing communities in the North Central Texas region and beyond, and to help students develop an understanding of their individual role in addressing those challenges through community service and volunteer activity.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Social Issues in the spring of 2013. This course utilized major theoretical perspectives from Sociology to explore causes and consequences of contemporary social problems in American society such as alienation, family stresses, poverty, unemployment, and technological change.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Human Rights in the spring of 2013. Using the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights as a basis, this course will examine human rights and human rights violations from a global perspective. Concepts of universality and indivisibility will be used to study human rights and human rights related issues. This

course will also trace the development and history of human rights as they have evolved. Ethical issues in human rights violations will also be examined.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Methods of Social Work Research in the fall of 2012. This course emphasizes principles of the scientific method for building knowledge of and evaluating practice. Topics include: ethical and cultural issues in research; research design and methodology; quantitative and qualitative research strategies; evaluation of practice; critical evaluation of published research; and completion and reporting of research projects.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Methods and Skills of Social Work Interviewing in the fall of 2012. Beginning social work skills introduced include the principles of conducting the helping interview, initial client contact, attending, and listening, empathetic responses, exploration and elaboration, questioning, gaining cooperation, self-disclosure, and termination issues. Issues of problem solving with diverse populations and persons from different cultural backgrounds as well as ethical issues of helping relationships are explored.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Human Behavior in the Social Environment II in the spring of 2012. This course is a continuation of Human Behavior and Social Environment I with emphasis on theories and knowledge about the range of social systems in which individuals live and the ways in which systems deter people from achieving wellbeing. Values and ethical issues related to bio-psycho-social theories are included.

Adjunct Professor. Taught Methods of Social Work Research in the fall of 2011. This course emphasizes principles of the scientific method for building knowledge of and evaluating practice. Adjunct Instructor. Taught Human Sexuality and Health in the spring of 2016. This course introduces students to the major theories and concepts guiding research on human sexuality. Students learn how the study of sexuality informs public health practice. A number of controversial issues are explored including: sexuality education, sexual risk taking, sexual orientation, unwanted pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections and disease, and sexual harassment and violence. Ethical issues related to sexual health promotion are addressed.
