## RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

- Teaching Certification Exams at UNT Dallas: Overcoming the Challenges for Minority Students is the product of a qualitative study done over the course of 3 years (2013-2016). The study focuses mainly on the challenges faced by second language learners of Hispanic heritage and low-income African-American students enrolled in education programs at the University of Texas at Dallas. The article exposes common problems in education, reports the attempted solutions, and the approaches used to produce successful outcomes at the Texas Teaching Certification Exams.
- Executed an exhaustive critical research on the first literary works of the Spanish renowned author Carmen Martin Gaite. The research explores the testimonial character of the author's work and relates it to the Spanish dictatorship of the era. The study questions the lack of interest on her first essays by the author's critics. It also connects the "forgotten" works to the unique Martingaitean voice of her anthology. The investigation analyzes the value of her first two short stories, first essay and attempt at first novel, published after her death. It focuses on the

characteristics that will later become the pillars of Carmen Martin Gaite's work. The research suggests a rereading of the author's work based on the overlooked first pieces, for a better interpretation of her work entirely.

- Collaborated on the Roadmap to Redesign Project in Spanish, a U.S. Department of Education funded initiative whose goal was to establish an efficient means of spreading the ideas and practices of the Program in Course Redesign to other institutions within the United States. The research was conducted at Texas Tech University from 2003-2006, involving conventional and hybrid technology to enhance the learning of students. R2R partnered experienced, successful institutions with new institutions, using a streamlined redesign methodology. The project is now being used as a standard method of teaching at some US universities.
- Conducted a cultural study about African influence in Brazilian culture by performing linguistic and historic analysis on selected 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> century documents and correspondence held by the archives of the Biblioteca Publica do Estado da Bahia. The research took place in Brazil under the supervision of Dr. Luciano Tosta; Summer 2006.
- Conducted research and presented work about the difference of Portuguese from Portugal and Brazilian Portuguese, focusing on the similarity of the lexicon of the colony on the 16<sup>th</sup> century, held at the Faculdade de Letras da Universidade de Lisboa and Biblioteca Nacional de Portugal under the supervision of Dr. Antonio Ladeira; Summer, 2005.
