The following year, I was offered to advance to the Superintendent of Schools in the Bunker Hill, Illinois and two years later superintendent at the Paris Crestwood school district in Illinois. In 1999, I resigned my superintendent position and returned to Texas where I was selected in a dual role as assistant principal at Dimmitt High School and Gifted and Talented Coordinator for the Dimmitt ISD. In August of 2003, I joined the Dallas ISD where I served as the in the Dean of Instruction at Franklin Middle School and three years later,

2006, I was offered the opportunity to return to my first love, high school administration at Sunset High School Dallas.
