COURSE EVALUATION METHODS

- Field Observation and Reflections: You will have three different components to your field observations.
 Each component below should be recorded on a separate field observation log. You can find copies of the log on Blackboard.
 - a. **NDHS residency; log completion.** Approximate the number of hours you spend each week with your mentor teachers and write into the log.
 - b. NDHS observations
 - i. Activity: For one day, you will shadow a student and join them for their classes, lunch, passing period etc. and write a reflection; assignment details will be given. The visit will be organized and facilitated by course instructor.
 - ii. In collaboration with your mentor, arrange to observe teachers of your choice and those that are recommended to you.
 - c. **Off-site Observations.** Share your observation interests to your instructor. Observation will be organized for you in the month of December and have a corresponding written assignment.
- 2. Lead Teaching Week Assignment: The purpose of the Lead Teaching Week assignment is for you to reflect on your experiences during lead teaching week. In addition, the assignment will help your instructor to better support your growth as a teacher as you focus on teaching to increase student achievement. Through this assignment you will reflect on student work, assessment results and other data that demonstrate the impact of your planning and teaching on student learning. This assignment will be three parts: A pre-reflection; a post-reflection; and an analysis of student learning.
- 3. Attendance/Participation: Being present in class is critical to your success in this course not only or your own learning it shows a high level of professionalism necessary for the effective classroom teacher. In addition, being an active learner by participating in class discussions, asking questions and sharing your thinking at the core of this class. Each class session is worth one point.
