g. Summary of DoD information system or electronic collection. Answers to these questions should be consistent with security guidelines for release of information to the public.

(1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

Manpower Models (MODELS) is a collection of thirteen distinct applications developed in the 1970s which supports core manpower planning processes of accessing, classifying, retaining, promoting, mobilizing, distributing, and assigning Marines for the following organizations: DC, M&RA; Manpower Management (MM); Manpower Plans and Policy (MP) and Reserve Affairs (RA). The system contains manpower and personnel data such as Unit Table of Organization; Training Information; and Names, Ranks and Social Security Numbers. This data which is automatically updated daily is used for creating forecasting and simulations of active duty and reserve assignments, and end strength projections. MODELS has access to all Marine Corps active duty and reserve personnel data contained in the Operational Data Store Enterprise (ODSE) and Total Force Data Warehouse (TFDW) historical data that has been maintained since September 1988.

PII collected includes: Name, other names used, SSN, citizenship, gender, race/ethnicity, birth date, place of birth, home telephone number, personal email address, mailing/home address, religious preference, security clearance, spouse information, marital information, child information, medical information, disability information, military records, emergency contact information, education information.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

As a privacy measure, while MODELS temporarily stores the full SSN in its database, the system displays only the last four digits of a Marine's SSN in all system views and reports. Until such time the USMC's personnel systems, namely MCTFS-ODSE, utilize a new identifier for personnel such as EDI-PI, or the system is replaced by a follow-on system, MODELS will need to use SSNs as the unique identifier.

As with many information technology systems, MODELS has potential privacy risks in the areas of identity theft, unsolicited marketing, loss of customer faith in protecting their information, and compromise of sensitive information. However, potential privacy risks are mitigated through access restrictions, user roles and permissions, and annual Privacy and PII training. MODELS is used exclusively by authorized military, DoD personnel, and contractors supporting DoD. Personally Identifiable Information (PII) is not shared or released to any individual, business, organization, entity, or agency outside those exclusively listed in Section 2, paragraph h below. Only those users with the Administrator role are able to provide access to MODELS. Access to MODELS is provided on a need to know basis and via a valid Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) enable authentication. All MODELS users (to include contractors) receive mandatory Marine Corps sponsored Privacy Act and PII protection and spillage training annually to help safeguard the PII resident in MODELS. In addition, contractors receive an annual security briefing conducted by their companies Facility Security Officer (FSO) which includes safe handling of PII. These annual PII sessions include safe handling procedures that cover receiving, viewing, printing, forwarding, storing, and shredding of PII data.

Individuals cannot object to the collection of their PII by MODELS since there is no PII manually collected or input into MODELS. The opportunity to object to the collection of their PII is when they are civilian applicants desiring to enter into service with the Marine Corps. Should individuals object to the collection of their PII at that time, their ability to enter active/reserve duty would be impossible. The PII provided to MODELS through the interfacing systems identified in para 2. h. above is required to support core manpower planning processes of accessing, classifying, retaining, promoting, mobilizing, distributing, and assigning Marines for the following organizations: DC, M&RA Manpower Management (MM) Manpower Plans and Policy (MP) Reserve Affairs (RA).
