g. Summary of DoD information system or electronic collection. Answers to these questions should be consistent with security guidelines for release of information to the public.

(1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The purpose of the system is to provide support to Deputy Commandant, Manpower and Reserve Affairs (DC, M&RA), Manpower Management Integration Branch (MMIB); Force Augmentation.

MCFAPS provides capabilities in the management of the Individual Augmentation (IA) process as part of the Marine Corps total force mobilization, activation, integration, and deactivation plan. The IA process entails the assignment of active duty (Regular and Active Reserve (AR) and/or Reserve (IMA, IRR, SMCR or Retiree)) members to IA requirements.

The type of personal information about a Marine collected in MCFAPS includes: Name, Other names used, Full and truncated SSN, DoD ID number, Citizenship, Legal Status, Gender, Race/Ethnicity, Birth date, Place of Birth, Home Telephone Number, Mailing/Home Address, Marital Status, Financial information, Medical Information, Disability Information, Employment Information, Military Records, Emergency Contact Information, and Education Information.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

The data contained in MCFAPS is exposed to privacy threats such as: identity theft, disgruntled employee, acts of nature (fire, flood, etc.), sabotage, computer hackers, and information warfare. To provide a layer of protection, access is provided on a need to know basis via a valid Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) solution.

Mitigation(s):

- 1) All MCFAPS users receive security training on a continuous basis to keep users alert to security requirements.
- 2) Access controls: Only users with Government approved accounts and a need-to-know are able to view data published by MCFAPS through a Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) Common Access Card (CAC) enabled authentication process. All MCFAPS users to include contractors receive mandatory Marine Corps sponsored Privacy Act and PII protection and spillage training annually. This training for safe handling procedures cover receiving, viewing, printing, forwarding, storage and shredding of PII.
- 3) Confidentiality & Integrity: Only those users with the System Administrator role are able to provide access to MCFAPS. Access to MCFAPS is provided on a need to know basis and via a valid Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) enable authentication.

Physical Security: MCFAPS is hosted in the Marine Corps Enterprise Information Technology Services (MCEITS) secure hosting facility located in Kansas City, MO.

SAIC is the MCFAPS contractor. Contractors sign a Non Disclosure Agreement (NDA) to assure confidentiality between the contractor and government to protect any type of confidential and proprietary information.

Specific language in the contract is described as:

Security measures shall be taken to satisfy the security requirements in accordance with the Marine Corps System Security Plan. MCFAPS data/information shall be protected from an Information Systems Security (INFOSEC) perspective. The contractor shall apply security considerations to software design and management.

Only contractors who have a valid need to know and a favorably adjudicated background investigation are permitted to have access to MCFAPS. During the course of routine system maintenance contractors may be exposed to PII. Users are DoD employees or authorized contractors supporting the DoD.
