

# **Greater Atlantic Region Bulletin**

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### **Measures to Address Slippage in the Atlantic Herring Fishery**

Effective Date: May 4, 2016

NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service partially approved Framework Adjustment 4 to the Atlantic Herring Fishery Management Plan. This action clarifies slippage requirements, requires slippage to be reported via the vessel monitoring system, and establishes slippage consequences.

#### **Clarifications to Slippage Requirements**

When a vessel issued a limited access herring permit is carrying an observer:

- Slippage (catch discarded before being brought on board for sampling by an observer) due to safety, mechanical failure, and excess catch of spiny dogfish is categorized as an *allowable slippage event*.
- Slippage for any other reason is categorized as a *non-allowable slippage event* and is prohibited.
- Fish not brought on board the vessel and made available to the observer because of gear damage is categorized as an allowable slippage event and triggers a slippage consequence measure.
- Fish not brought on board the vessel and made available to the observer because fish fell out of and off the gear is categorized as a discard event (not slippage) and does not trigger a slippage consequence measure.
- Operational discards (small amounts of fish left in the net after pumping) are allowed on board purse seine and small mesh bottom trawl vessels and on board midwater trawl vessels fishing outside of the Groundfish Closed Areas.

When a midwater trawl vessel issued a herring permit is fishing in the Groundfish Closed Areas:

- Vessels must leave the Groundfish Closed Areas following an allowable slippage event and remain outside of the Groundfish Closed Areas for the remainder of that fishing trip.
- Operational discards are prohibited.

#### **Slippage Reporting Requirement**

The operators of vessels issued a limited access herring permit must report all slippage events via the vessel monitoring system when the vessel is carrying an observer. An example of the herring daily catch report used to report slippage is on the next page of this letter.

## **Slippage Consequence Measures**

When a vessel issued a Category A or B limited access herring permit is carrying an observer:

- Vessels must move and remain at least 15 nautical miles away from an allowable slippage event for the remainder of that fishing trip.
- Vessels must terminate the trip and return to port following a non-allowable slippage event.
