(3) Boxcars described in subparagraph (1) of this paragraph, located in the States of Connecticut, Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, or Vermont may be loaded to stations on the lines of the car owner only if routed via the car owning railroad.

(4) No common carrier by railroad subject to the Interstate Commerce Act shall accept from shipper any loaded boxcar for movements contrary to the provisions of subparagraph (2) and subparagraph (3) of this paragraph.

(b) *Application.* The provisions of this order shall apply to intrastate, interstate, and foreign commerce.

(c) *Effective date.* This order shall become effective at 11:59 p.m., November 28, 1970.

(d) *Expiration date.* This order shall expire at 11:59 p.m., May 31, 1971, unless otherwise modified, changed, or suspended by order of this Commission.

All relevant matters presented have been considered and the proposal is adopted as published, except that the following mammals are deleted from the list as it was proposed:

The list of endangered foreign fish and wildlife has been compiled from data supplied by international conservation organizations, foreign fish and wildlife agencies, individual scientists, and trade sources. If a candidate species is not listed, it may be because it is not endangered throughout its range or because there is insufficient evidence to warrant its inclusion on the list at this time. The list is under continual review. Factual data are welcome and should be submitted. The "where found" column is a general guide to the native countries or regions where the named animals are found. It is not intended to be definitive. The use of a triepomial (third name) in the Scientific Name indicates there are one or more subspecies of the animal which are not endangered.
