



Roger Snyder – Manager

Roger E. Snyder was named Manager of the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Pacific Northwest Site Office (PNSO) in August of 2011. As Manager, Mr. Snyder is responsible for providing operational and institutional stewardship and oversight of the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL), one of DOE's world-class national laboratories.

After joining DOE in 1990 as a Defense Programs Technical Intern, Roger has since worked in NNSA, EM and Science at the HQ, Operations Office and Site level. Over his career he has served at 12 sites and supported program planning and execution across most of the Department's programs. Prior to coming to PNSO, he served as the Deputy Manager for the DOE National Nuclear Security Administration's (NNSA) Los Alamos Site Office (LASO), overseeing over \$2 billion annually in programs and projects as well as providing stewardship for the more than 2,000 facilities on over 23,000 acres comprising Los Alamos National Laboratory.

In addition to earning a B.S. in Engineering from the University of Illinois and a M.S. in Engineering from the University of Maryland, Roger is also certified as a DOE, Stanford and PMI certified Project Manager. During his career, Roger has also completed studies at the George Washington University (Advanced Masters), Defense Acquisition University (Contracting Officer), MIT (Nuclear Power program), Stanford (Advanced Project Management), and Harvard (Senior Executive Fellows).

Engaging regularly with academia and students, Roger serves as an accreditor for the ABET (Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology) and as the Chair, Washington State University – Tri-Cities Engineering Advisory Board.
