- g. Summary of DoD information system or electronic collection. Answers to these questions should be consistent with security guidelines for release of information to the public.
 - (1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The purpose of SAMS is to continue the ongoing need for commandant, area commanders, and field level commanding officers to assess medical operational readiness within legacy environments. This relationship is based on the ability of SAMS to:

- · Store, process, and retrieve medical data
- Monitor the operating site's medical environment
- Provide administrative support for patient medical encounters (PMEs)
- Support medical supply management

Types of personal information about individuals collected in the system: name, date of birth, SSN, race/ethnicity, gender, military records: rank, pay grade, Command information: address, Unique Identification Code (UIC), medical information: Immunization data, Medical ICD 9/10 Codes, Physician notes on patient care and Other: User type (Active Duty and Reserve Military), User ID.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

All systems are vulnerable to "insider threats". SAMS managers are vigilant to this threat by limiting system access to those individuals who have a defined need to access the information. There are defined criteria to identify who should have access to SAMS. These individuals have gone through extensive background and employment investigations. SAMS program is always evaluating risks in safeguarding data in the application. SAMS does, at a minimum, an annual review of its DoD 8500 application security controls, follows OMB Communications- 202-395-7254, and Best Practices. In an effort to make the federal government's identity theft awareness, prevention, detection, and prosecution efforts more effective and efficient, the Office of Management and Budget, (OMB), along with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), list of best practices to help agencies improve the security and privacy of their information systems is incorporated into SAMS IA testing. Each risk listed in the Certification report to the ODAA, in categories ranging from security and privacy training for personnel to procurement issues, is associated with selected best practices and important resources to help SAMS mitigate and avoid these risks. These controls and their compliance, submitted in the DIACAP process, are evaluated to provide the best possible safeguards of privacy information.
