 - (1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

CFMS is a comprehensive financial management system that provides funds administration, budget formulation and financial reporting capabilities to CNIC headquarters and its lower echelon activities. At no time can information be retrieved by name or other unique identifier such as SSN; no such query interface is provided.

The civilian labor budget formulation and analysis process requires the combination of select Total Workforce Management System (TWMS) and Standard Accounting and Reporting System - Field Level (STARS-FL) data to produce CNIC accelerated labor data. The TWMS ID is used to replace the social security number, minimizing risk.

PII collected and stored in CFMS includes: Name, TWMS ID number, and Employment Information.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

The primary risk associated with the CFMS PII data is unauthorized access (internal threat) to PII data; however, access to PII data are restricted to named users with a need to know. Access to the 1960 Labor Suspense table is by name only, restricted to only persons involved in the labor correction process.

All PII data in CFMS are loaded via automated interfaces. These data are encrypted during the file transfer process using Secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP). The load process replaces the full social security number with the TWMS ID. Data are not combined to generate additional PII data.

PII data are not directly input into the system by end users and CFMS "free text" fields are monitored for potential PII data; tables are scanned monthly and the data are removed as necessary. Access to PII data in CFMS is restricted to those users with a bona fide need to view the data and controlled by access privileges.

In addition to the explicit controls that are implemented in CFMS to protect PII data, a banner is displayed for all users upon logon, instructing them that PII data must not be entered into CFMS. Users must consent to the direction prior to completing their logon process. All users must complete both the DoD information Assurance Awareness Training and the Training for Personally Identifiable Information prior to receiving a CFMS user account.
