 - (1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

TFRS integrates workflow and information on personnel retention requirements. The purpose of the system is to track and monitor career planning for reenlistment, extension, lateral moves, overseas extensions, and special duty assignments of personnel. TFRS assists in overall recruitment goals and assignments.

The type of personal information about a Marine collected in TFRS includes: Name, SSN (full and truncated), citizenship, legal status, gender, race/ethnicity, birth date, place of birth, security clearance, spouse information, marital status, financial information, medical information, law enforcement information, military records, education information.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

TFRS temporarily stores the full SSN in its database. However, as an added privacy measure, the system only displays the SSN when entered by the user. SSN has been replaced by DoD ID Number on reports and search features.

Until such time as the USMC's personnel systems, namely MCTFS and ODSE, utilize a new identifier for personnel such as DoD ID Number, or the system is replaced by a follow-on system, TFRS will require the use of SSNs as the unique identifier. Current plans are for all manpower systems that interface with MCTFS and ODSE to implement DoD ID Number within one year of MCTFS and ODSE's implementation anticipated to be during the 4th quarter FY13.

As with many information technology systems, TFRS has potential privacy risks in the areas of identity theft, unsolicited marketing, loss of customer faith in protecting their information, and compromise of sensitive information. However, potential privacy risks are mitigated through access restrictions, user roles and permissions, and annual Privacy and PII training.

Personally Identifiable Information (PII) is not shared or released to any individual, business, organization, entity, or agency outside those exclusively listed in Section 2, paragraph h below. Only those users with the Administrator role are able to provide access to TFRS. Access to TFRS is provided on a need to know basis and via a valid Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) enable authentication. All TFRS users (to include contractors) receive mandatory Marine Corps sponsored Privacy Act and PII protection and spillage training annually to help safeguard the PII resident in TFRS. In addition, contractors receive an annual security briefing conducted by their companies Facility Security Officer (FSO) which includes safe handling of PII. These annual PII sessions for safe handling procedures cover receiving, viewing, printing, forwarding, storing, and shredding of PII data.

TFRS is used exclusively by authorized Marines and contractors supporting the Marine Corps. TFRS is vulnerable to privacy threats such as environmental effects, paper to digital conversion, information warfare, sabotage, disposition and destruction of paper files, or localized disruptions caused by physical attacks and destruction as well as records loss or unauthorized update/modification of records in the system. Physical access to the TFRS servers is controlled by M&RA personnel.
