

U.S. gasoline prices increase for first time since mid-June (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline rose for the first time since June to \$2.19 a gallon on Monday. That's up 4.4 cents from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the West Coast states at 2.57 a gallon, up 3.9 cents from a week ago. Prices were lowest in the Gulf Coast states at 1.96 a gallon, up 2.6 cents.
