U.S. gasoline prices decrease for first time in three weeks (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline fell for the first time in three weeks to \$3.59 a gallon on Monday. That's down 2.1 cents from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the West Coast region at 3.80 a gallon, up 4.7 cents from a week ago. Prices were lowest in the Gulf Coast States at 3.38 a gallon, down 2.9 cents.
