U.S. gasoline prices decreased (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline fell to \$3.27 a gallon on Monday. That's down 2.1 cents from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the New England and West Coast regions at 3.48 a gallon, up 2.2 cents in New England and up 1.8 cents on the West Coast from a week ago. Prices were lowest in the Rocky Mountain region at 3.11 a gallon, down 3.2 cents.
