Dear Mr. Moberg:

This is a partial response to your request for records that you made to the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. 552.

You have requested the following:

A copy of all contracts between the BPA, and/or its agents, and TerrAqua, Inc. A copy of all correspondence between the BPA, and/or its agents, and Mike Ward (a/k/a Mike Wardski).

A copy of all correspondence between the BPA, and/or its agents, and TerrAqua, Inc.

Response:

BPA is providing a copy of all contracts between the BPA and/or its agents and TerrAqua, Inc. either in their entirety or with some information withheld under Exemption 4 and 6. The exemptions are explained below.

Under Exemption 4 of FOIA, information may be exempt from disclosure if it is "commercial" in nature, is "obtained [by BPA] from a person (TerrAqua, Inc.)," and is "privileged or confidential." Here, there is no question that the redacted information in the contract is commercial in nature and that BPA obtained it from TerrAqua, Inc.

Under Exemption 6 of FOIA, BPA asserts this exemption for information which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy if disclosed. The withheld information consists of the names and personal contact information (address, email, and/or phone numbers) of employees and sub-contractors of TerrAqua, Inc. Release of this information could subject these individuals to unwanted intrusions of privacy. There is no public interest in the disclosure of this information because it does not shed any light on how BPA has performed its statutory duties.

Due to the size of the responsive documents they cannot be posted. To obtain

Pursuant to 10 CFR 1004.8, if you are dissatisfied with this determination, or the adequacy of the search, you may appeal in writing within 30 calendar days of receipt of a final response letter. The appeal should be made to the Director, Office of Hearings and Appeals, HG-1, Department of Energy, 1000 Independence Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20585-1615. The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA Appeal is being made.

A copy of all correspondence between the BPA and/or its agents, and Mike Ward (a/k/a Mike Wardski).

Response:

In an earlier letter, dated November 17, 2011, BPA partially released copies of all contracts between the BPA and/or its agents and TerrAqua, Inc.

Enclosed in this final release are copies of draft reports, contracts, correspondence, and invoices either in their entirety or with some information withheld under Exemption 4.

Under Exemption 4 of FOIA, information may be exempt from disclosure if it is "commercial" in nature, is "obtained [by BPA] from a person (TerrAqua, Inc.)," and is "privileged or confidential." Here, there is no question that the redacted information in the contract is commercial in nature and that its release would likely cause TerrAqua, Inc., substantial competitive harm.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 1004.8, if you are dissatisfied with this determination, or the adequacy of the search, you may appeal in writing within 30 calendar days of receipt of a final response letter. The appeal should be made to the Director, Office of Hearings and Appeals, HG-1, Department of Energy, 1000 Independence Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20585-1615. The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA Appeal is being made.
