

I am interested in examining the concept in our education system, and in our society, that academic success is directly correlated to success in the work place. Specifically, I am interested to see if academic attainment is correlated to success in the federal work place. In the USA, higher education is producing between 400 to 600 PhD in Anthropology a year and of these, only 30% go into teaching.
