Through our programs, we hope to increase knowledge and understanding of protected marine species/species of concern from Maine to Virginia, as well as the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA).

We would like to encourage organizations such as yours to help spread this celebratory message and educate your audiences on the importance of endangered species protection and promote the continued conservation and awareness of marine endangered species, such as sturgeon, whales and sea turtles.
