NOAA Fisheries Clarifies Gulf of Maine Cod Interim Management Measures
Gillnet Vessels Can Change Category
Gulf of Maine Cod Trip Limits in Gulf of Maine Broad Stock Area
Effective Date: December 29, 2014 through May 12, 2015

Gillnet Vessels Allowed One-Time Opportunity To Change Category Designation

The interim rule to increase protections for Gulf of Maine (GOM) cod modified gillnet management measures mid-season for vessels fishing in the GOM by reducing the number of nets that may be fished by Day gillnet vessels. Because vessel owners did not have a prior opportunity to consider this change when they made their 2014 annual designation as a Day or Trip gillnet vessel, we are allowing gillnet vessel owners a one-time opportunity to change their fishing year 2014 designation. All groundfish gillnet vessels should have received a letter announcing this opportunity. 200-lb Trip Limit Applies to Vessels Fishing in the Gulf of Maine Broad Stock Area

We are clarifying that the 200-lb cod trip limit applies to the entire Gulf of Maine (GOM) Broad Stock Area. The 200-lb trip limit does not apply to that portion of the GOM Regulated Mesh Area off Cape Cod that overlaps the Inshore Georges Bank Broad Stock Area. Please see the map on the reverse.
