New Vessel Monitoring System Software Boatrac Users

Effective Date: March 18, 2014

On March 17, 2014, Boatrac will automatically update the macros on your VMS unit to comply with recent regulatory changes. Please make sure that the new macros are installed on your VMS by following these steps: (1) Go to Macro #14 and check that the top of the macro states “Vessel Activity Report V15.0”; and (2) Go to Macro #35 and check that the top of the macro shows “V10”. If you do not receive the macro update, please contact Boatrac at 1-800-262-8722.

Please begin using the new macros for trips on or after March 18, 2014. You will not be compliant with the regulations if your vessel sails on or after this date with the older macros.

Macro Numbering Changes

In order to accommodate some new macros, please be aware of the following macro numbering changes. All other macros remain the same as before.

Requirement to Enter Your Operator Permit Number

With the exception of the declaration macros #14 through #24, all VMS reports now require that the vessel operator for that trip enter their 8-digit ‘Federal Vessel Operator Permit Number’ in the ‘Operator’s Permit Number’ field. This should not be confused with the vessel permit number. As an official record, this information helps us to determine responsibility for reporting requirements from trip to trip.

Summary of Declaration Macro Changes

- Monkfish Research Set-Aside (RSA) Trips. You must now declare monkfish RSA days-at-sea from the monkfish declaration screen on your VMS unit, instead of through the IVR call-in system.
- Scallop Research Set-Aside Trips. To declare a scallop RSA trip, you must now make your fishing area selection in either the ‘General Category (LAGC) Permit’ or ‘Limited Access Permit’ section and then select ‘yes’ to the scallop RSA quota question at the bottom of the screen. For limited access special access area trips, remember to answer both the ‘compensation trip’ and ‘fishing area’ questions.
- Herring Trips. The declaration screen is now on its own page and you must answer questions pertaining to whether this is a carrier trip, gear type, mackerel/squid retention, and if you intend to harvest herring RSA quota.

4. Surfclam and Ocean Quahog Trips. The declaration screen is now on its own page. Trips into the Reopened Portion of the Georges Bank PSP Area must now be declared via VMS and you should no longer call the VMS Team when declaring this type of trip.

5. Mackerel and Longfin Squid Trips. There are two new declaration screens, one for each species. These trips must be declared via VMS when the requirement becomes effective on or about August 2014. For longfin squid trips, you will be able to declare your intent to harvest Longfin Squid RSA quota.

Summary of Reports Macro Changes

1. Multispecies Catch. Species kept must now be reported by statistical area fished; this will be used to determine the broad stock area fished. The 'All Fish Kept' field has been removed; instead, you must report each species kept and 'non-groundfish' kept by statistical area. We will add up groundfish and non-groundfish to calculate all fish kept. The 'Date Fish Caught' field includes a new selection for 'year'.

2. Multispecies Trip Start Hail and Trip End Hail. The start hail includes two new fields; one field for declaring any sector exemptions and a second field for declaring any sector operations plan provisions that you intend to fish under for the trip. The 'Estimated Arrival' and 'Estimated Offload' fields in both hail forms include a new selection for 'year'.

3. Herring Catch. The 'Date Fish Caught' field includes a new selection for 'year'. A new field asks whether you will fish mid-water trawl gear; if you select 'yes', the 'Total Fish Kept' field must be filled in before sending the form.

4. Herring Pre-Landing. The report is now required to be sent by all vessels declaring a herring trip. A 'VTR' field has been added. The 'Estimated Arrival' field includes a new selection for 'year'.

5. Mackerel and Longfin Squid Catch. This is a new report which must be sent via VMS when the requirement becomes effective on or about August 2014.

6. Mackerel Pre-Landing. This is a new report for vessels with landings exceeding 20,000 lbs. The report must be sent via VMS when the requirement becomes effective on or about August 2014.

7. RSA/EFP Trip Start Hail and RSA/EFP Trip End Hail. These are two new VMS reports. You must now send both a trip start hail and trip end hail from your VMS unit when RSA compensation fishing or fishing under an EFP. These reporting requirements will be addressed in the permit that authorizes the compensation fishing or experimental fishing activity.

Reminder of VMS Requirements

Sector Vessel Owners/Operators. If your sector is exempt from continuous VMS reporting at the dock/mooring, you must (1) keep your VMS powered up if you have other permits requiring continuous reporting, or (2) send the Power Down declaration at Macro #24 prior to powering off your VMS.
