<u>Northeast Multispecies Fishing Vessels</u> Changes to Eastern U.S./Canada Area Quota Monitoring Catch Apportioned by Areas Fished

Effective immediately; Retroactively applied to May 1, 2013.

In response to input from both the New England Fishery Management Council and the fishing industry, we are changing how catches for cod, haddock, and yellowtail flounder in the Eastern U.S./Canada Area are tracked. The statistical areas reported on vessel monitoring system (VMS) catch reports and vessel trip reports (VTRs) will be used to apportion catch to specific stock allocations. This change reinstates the practice that was followed by NMFS since the implementation of Amendment 16 in May 2010. We will publish a final rule to permanently implement this change as soon as possible. We will send an additional bulletin when the final rule is issued.

NMFS is also considering implementing a requirement that vessels declared into the Eastern U.S./Canada Area submit daily VMS catch reports, as recommended to NMFS by the Council. The Regional Administrator has the authority to require daily VMS reports. If vessel reporting requirements change we will broadly announce the new requirements.

Why is NMFS making this Change?	NMFS implemented changes for Eastern U.S/Canada Area quota monitoring for the 2013 fishing year that began May 1 as interim measures in conjunction with Framework Adjustment 48. These changes apportioned all catch on a trip, regardless of where caught, to the Eastern U.S./Canada Area if a vessel was declared and entered into the area. Recent correspondence from the Council clarified that its intent in Amendment 16 is consistent with the apportionment by area method.
