SUMMER FLOUNDER, SCUP, AND BLACK SEA BASS FISHERIES

SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

2013 RECREATIONAL HARVEST MEASURES & 2013 BLACK SEA BASS SPECIFICATIONS INCREASE

Effective date: June 20, 2013

We have approved the final 2013 minimum fish size, angler possession limits, and fishing season rules for the summer flounder (fluke), scup (porgies), and black sea bass (sea bass) recreational fisheries. States have already put their rules in place for the season. In addition, we have implemented an increase in the 2013 and 2014 black sea bass commercial quota and recreational harvest limit.

Based on a recommendation from the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council, we have approved an **increase to the overall catch limit for black sea bass**. This results in a new recreational harvest limit of 2.26 million lb and a new commercial quota of 2.17 million lb. Please see Table 1, below, for more detail.

This rule maintains conservation equivalency for the **summer flounder** fishery. Conservation equivalency means that we have waived the Federal recreational bag limit, minimum fish size, and fishing season, and vessel owners are subject only to regulations in their state. Please see Table 2, below, for the 2013 state-by-state recreational management measures.

This rule also maintains the year-round open season for recreational **scup** fishing. The minimum fish size is now 10 inches, and the possession limit is 30 scup per person. Please keep in mind that, if the Federal minimum size, possession limit, and/or season differ from the regulations for the state in which you will be landing, you must follow the more restrictive regulations.

For the 2013 **black sea bass** recreational fishery, we have implemented a minimum fish size of 12.5 inches, a possession limit of 20 black sea bass per person, and open seasons of May 19-October 14 and November 1-December 31. Please keep in mind that, if the Federal minimum size, possession limit, and/or season differ from the regulations for the state in which you will be landing, you must follow the more restrictive regulations.
