Under Federal Regulations at 50 CFR 635.5, for all Atlantic HMS tournaments that are conducted from a port in an Atlantic coastal state, including the U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico, a tournament operator must:

(1) Register at least four (4) weeks before the tournament begins. The tournament is only registered once the operator has received a confirmation number from the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS).

(2) If selected by NMFS, operators must submit the catch and effort report from the tournament on an HMS tournament summary reporting form, no later than seven (7) days after the conclusion of the tournament.

Thank you for helping NMFS track HMS recreational activities. The information collected through HMS tournament registration and reporting is used in stock assessments and national statistical reports.

PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT NOTICE: Collection of information through tournament registration and reporting provides essential information for the conservation and management of highly migratory species. This information will be used to estimate recreational landings of these species through tournaments and may be used to estimate fishing effort. Public reporting burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 2 minutes per response (tournament registration), including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. Tournament operators may voluntarily elect for NMFS to release information to the public regarding tournament name, date(s), city, state, and target species.

Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, no person is required to respond to, nor shall any person be subject to a penalty for failure to comply with, a collection of information subject to the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act, unless that collection of information displays a currently valid OMB Control Number.

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
