Enclosed are copies of the Final Certificates of Apportionment under the provisions of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act and the Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act, as amended. These apportionments are for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2015, and are available for the periods of time specified in the Acts.

These final apportionments are based on deposits into the Wildlife Restoration Fund and the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund during Fiscal Year 2015. The amounts reflect sequestered amounts of \$24,292,040 in the Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund and \$47,292,497 in the Wildlife Restoration Trust Fund for 2016. In addition, \$59,137,413 million in the Wildlife Restoration Trust Fund and \$25,377,643 million in the Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund that were sequestered in FY 2015 have been apportioned for your use.

The Service is pleased to make these funds available to you. If you have questions about the apportionments, please contact the Fish and Wildlife Service Regional Director for your area.

CERTIFICATE OF APPORTIONMENT OF \$695,141,699 OF THE APPROPRIATION FOR PITTMAN-ROBERTSON WILDLIFE RESTORATION (CFDA NO. 15.611) TO THE STATES, THE COMMONWEALTH OF PUERTO RICO, GUAM, THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS, AMERICAN SAMOA, AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016.

Pursuant to the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act, as amended (16 U.S.C. 669 et seq.), I have, at this time, apportioned \$695,141,699 to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. The funds so apportioned are based on the amount credited during Fiscal Year 2015 to the Federal Aid to Wildlife Restoration Fund. This includes \$59,137,413 that was sequestered in 2015 and is now available. A preliminary apportionment of \$504,552,818 was made on December 2, 2015, and is included as part of this final apportionment. The funds are available for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2015, and are available for the period specified in the Act.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$564,563,840 available to the States as provided by Section 4(b) of the Act. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 5 percent or less than one-half of 1 percent of the amount apportioned under Section 4(b). This includes \$48,542,170 of 2015 sequestered funds. In addition, I have made \$236,750 available in accordance with Section 10(c)(2) of the Act, apportioning this amount in accordance with Section 4(b). Amounts apportioned to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 8A of the Act.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$122,537,840 available as provided by Section 4(c) of the Act. This includes \$10,011,243 of 2015 sequestered funds. The

amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 4(c).

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$7,456,000 in new funding available as provided by Section 10(a) of the Act. I have also made \$584,000 in 2015 sequestered funds available. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 10(a). Amounts apportioned to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 4(c) of the Act.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, the final apportionment of Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration funds for Fiscal Year 2016 is as shown on the enclosed tables.

Pursuant to the Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act, as amended (16 U.S.C. 777 et seq.), we have, at this time, apportioned \$361,077,093 to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and the District of Columbia. The funds so apportioned are based on the amount credited during Fiscal Year 2015 to the Sport Fish Restoration Account. This includes \$25,377,643 that was sequestered in 2015 and is now available. A preliminary apportionment of \$239,902,227 was made on December 2, 2015, and is included as part of this final apportionment. The funds are available for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2015, and are available for the period of time specified in the Act.

The amounts apportioned to the States are as provided by Section 4 of the Act, and adjusted so no State shall receive more than 5 percent or less than 1 percent of the total amount apportioned.

The amounts apportioned to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and the District of Columbia are as provided by Section 12 of the Act.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, the apportionment of Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration funds for Fiscal Year 2016 is as shown on the enclosed tabulation.
