Clarified Income Verification Language

- "Form that documents review and approval of: income eligibility using verifiable documentation of household income and number of individuals for the entire household.
 - 'Verifiable' refers to any documentation that can be verified by another source (e.g. pay stub, copies of IRS form 1040, Section 8 eligibility, etc.)"
- This can be done by the utility or an agent acting on behalf of the utility (i.e. a CAP or a program implementer)

Clarity on repair costs

- Examples now included in measure payment chart:
 - Repair roof leak
 - Address dry-rot in window framing
 - Replace rotten threshold
- Repair costs must be documented on contractor invoices and reported separately.

Clarity on installation & repair costs

Home Type	Low Income Qualifying Measure	Installed Measure Cost Payment - dollar for dollar (except as noted)	Repair Cost Payment - dollar for dollar (examples)
Single - Family	Attic Insulation (up to R49) Floor Insulation (up to R30) Wall Insulation (up to R11)	Dollar for dollar Dollar for dollar Dollar for dollar	Examples include: repair roof leak, re- build external entrance covering, fix hole in siding.
	Prime Window	Dollar for dollar, not to exceed \$20/square foot Dollar for dollar,	Examples include: address dry-rot in window framing, replace rotten threshold, repair cracked header.
	Patio Door Exterior Insulated Door	not to exceed \$20/square foot Dollar for dollar, not to exceed \$400/door	
	Whole House Air Sealing Prescriptive Air Sealing	Dollar for dollar	Examples include: repair attic access hatch, or pull- down stairs
	PTCS Duct Sealing Prescriptive Duct Sealing	Dollar for dollar Dollar for dollar	Examples include: replace rusted duct, repair broken filter slot
	Ductless Heat Pump	Dollar for dollar, not to exceed \$3,800/unit	Examples include: improve structural support for interior head.
