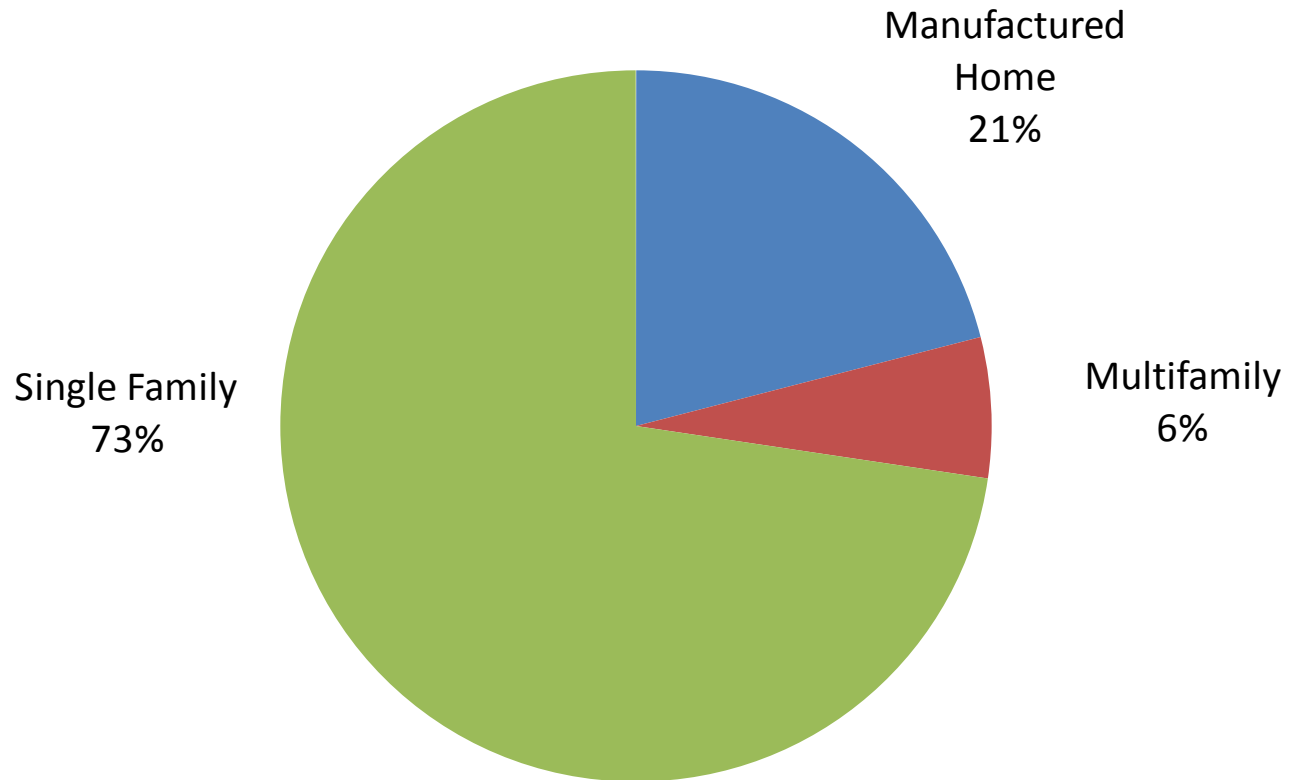

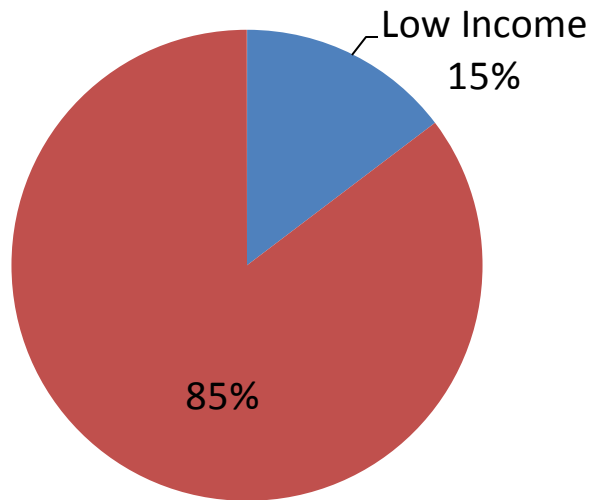
Weatherization Savings by Building Type



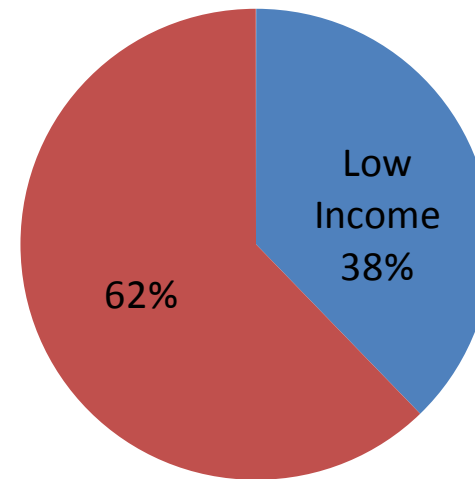
Includes insulation, air sealing, windows, duct sealing, and insulated door savings

Single Family Homes



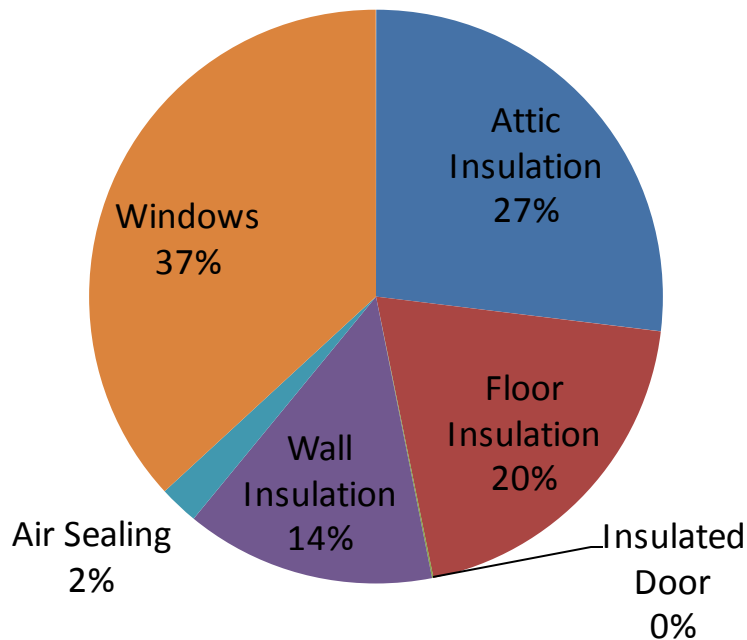
Manufactured Homes



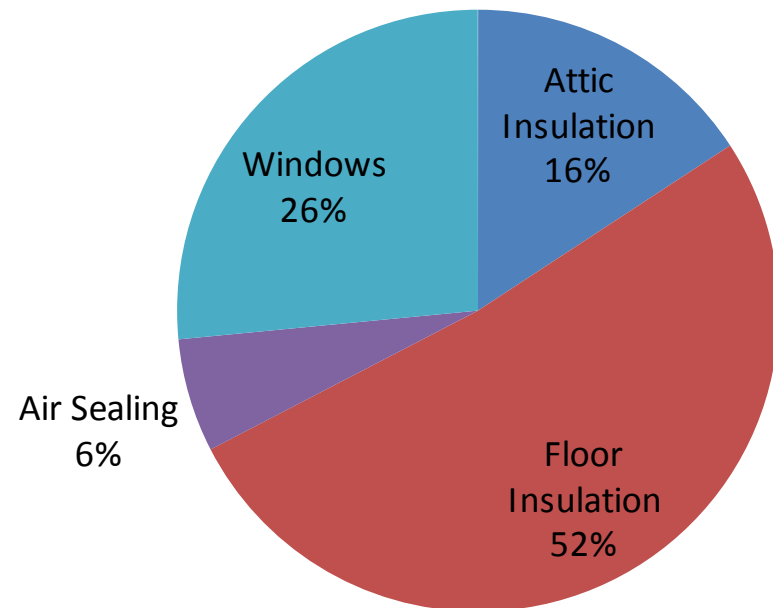
