Agricultural Sector

Effective Immediately

Correction: In the Irrigation Systems Upgrades Specifications and Requirements section added clarifying language, "Brass impact sprinklers shall be rebuilt by an established repair shop and shall meet or exceed manufacturers' specifications."

Rationale: Brings uniformity between the IM and UES Measures List.

Correction: In the Variable Frequency Drives in Agricultural Turbine Pump Applications Documentation Requirements table, added clarifying language to "Completed Turbine Pump VFD Energy Savings Calculator (available in the <u>Document Library</u>) regardless of completion date."

Rationale: Brings greater clarity to the programmatic requirements.

Effective Immediately

Correction: In the Variable Frequency Drives in Agricultural Turbine Pump Applications section:

- Modified the reference "All new VFD installations must meet IEEE 519 standards" to "BPA recommends" in the Requirements and Specifications subsection.
- Added clarifying language, "BPA no longer collects information for this measure from the BPA Qualified and Provisionally Deemed Input Sheet" from the Requirements and Specifications subsection.

Rationale: Removes additional documentation requirements for customers.

Commercial Sector

Correction: Roof and Attic Insulation

Rationale: This language was updated to differentiate between roof and attic insulation measures as they apply to K-8 schools. This distinction allows for increased incentives.

Change: The Energy Smart Grocer (ESG) section has been updated to reflect the contractor name change. CLEAResult is now listed as the contractor instead of PECI.

Rationale: This language was updated to reflect the current name of the contractor.



Commercial Sector

Clarification: An end of program section has been added to the ESG section, but timing related to close-out options is currently unknown

Rationale: This language was added to clarify the end of program.

Clarification: Ductless Heat Pumps

Rationale: Removed requirements that were deemed unnecessary.

Change: Effective October 1, 2015, the Energy Smart Industrial's High Performance Energy Management & Track and Tune program components and requirements will be consolidated into Strategic Energy Management Projects.

Rationale: Makes it easier for customers to understand

Lighting:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)

- New CFL and LED measures are now available.
- * Note new Low Use, Mod/High Use categories.

Effective October 1, 2015:

- Globe CFLs will be included in the General Purpose CFL measure category for payment.
- General Purpose CFLs Retail will be reduced to \$0.75.





Lighting/Showerheads/Advanced Power Strips:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)

- Delivery mechanisms for lighting, showerheads and APS were consolidated into four categories:
 - Retail
 - Direct Install
 - By Request (includes former Mail by Request, Over the Counter, Other)
 - Mailed Non-Request (bulbs only, limited to 4 per household/fiscal year)
- APS Clarification: The Requirements and Specifications for Residential Advanced Power Strips has been clarified to more clearly state that the APS must be used on home entertainment centers only (TV with any combination of peripherals).
- An APS End User Survey is now available both Print and Online versions



Appliances:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)

- New Retail measures for Refrigerators, Freezers, Clothes Washers
 - These measures are available through Simple Steps

Effective October 1, 2015)

- Refrigerator, Freezer, and Clothes Washer measures will be updated
- "Upright Freezer" measure will be expired, "Any Freezer" will remain
- Most Top Loader Clothes Washers will no longer be eligible, some may
- Savings for Refrigerator Decommissioning will decrease and
- Savings for Freezer Decommissioning will increases
 - Payment will decrease for both



Water Heaters:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)

- BPA will no longer provide payment for AirGenerate/Electrolux Heat Pump Water Heaters
 - These have been removed from the HPWH Qualified Product List

Effective October 1, 2015)

 Residential Electric Storage Water Heaters measures will be expired due to the new Federal Standard



Ducted HVAC:

Effective October 1, 2015)

- PTCS Duct Sealing measures will be summarized to any Electric Heat
- Duct sealing measures for New Single Family will be expired
 - PTCS and Prescriptive
- PTCS Duct Sealing Specification was updated April 1, 2015 (eff. 10/1/15)
- Prescriptive Duct Sealing Spec was updated April 1, 2015 (eff. 10/1/15)
- PTCS Open Loop Ground Water Source Heat Pump Specification was updated April 1, 2015 (eff. 10/1/15)
- We will separate Heat Pump and Duct Sealing requirements in the next Implementation Manual



New Construction:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)

 New measures for New Energy Star Homes (WA) have been added to the Measure List.

Coming in October?

 New measures for New Energy Star Homes Oregon are anticipated for October



Weatherization:

Effective October 1, 2015

- Single Family Wx: Insulation, Window, Whole House Air Sealing measures will be expired and replace with updated savings and payments
 - Overall decrease of over 60% in savings, on average
 - Payments will be reduced, but only about 50%
- Single Family and Manufactured Window payments will decrease by 50%

Clarification:

 Reference to "audit or field notes" in the Documentation Requirements were removed. These requirements have been edited for clarity. No requirements were added or removed.

Effective October 1, 2015:

 Customers will be required to collect heating system type (i.e. electric zonal, forced air furnace, ASHP, GSHP, DHP) for homes received weatherization measures.



Low income Section:

Effective now (April 1, 2015)


Measures available in Low Income are:

- Insulation, Windows, Whole House and Prescriptive Air Sealing
- Exterior Doors
- PTCS and Prescriptive Duct Sealing
- Ductless Heat Pumps

*Not all measures available in all housing types

The Low Income Section had been updated to be more clear:

- More clarity on income verification
- More information on HVAC measures
- More examples on allowable installation and repair costs

Multi-Sector

Effective Immediately

Change: Effective October 1, 2015, Residential Electric Storage Water Heater measures will be expired.

Rationale: A new federal standard for efficiency went into effect in 2015 for electric storage water heaters, raising the baseline.
