## SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

Subject: Charter/Party and Recreational Vessel Regulations for Cod

Dear Northeast (NE) Multispecies Permit Holder:

NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has received a number of questions and concerns from owners/operators of charter/party vessels and private recreational anglers regarding the regulations for charter/party and recreational vessels, specifically related to fishing for cod. This letter clarifies the cod regulations for all NE multispecies permit holders that are either fishing as a charter/party vessel or as a private recreational vessel.

For persons on a charter/party or private recreational vessel fishing within the Gulf of Maine (GOM) Regulated Mesh Area (RMA) (see back of page), possession of cod is prohibited from November 1 to April 15. From April 16 through October 31, the minimum fish size is 24 inches, and there is a bag limit of 10 cod per person, per day.

For persons on a charter/party or private recreational vessel fishing outside of the GOM RMA, the minimum size for cod is 22 inches. For private recreational vessels only, there is a bag limit of 10 cod per person, per day. When fishing in areas outside of the GOM RMA, there is no bag limit for cod for charter/party vessels and no seasonal possession restrictions for either private recreational or charter/party vessels.


