## NOTICE OF INCREASED 2011 SCUP LANDING LEVELS

NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has implemented an increase to the 2011 scup (porgy) landing level allowances for both the commercial and recreational fisheries, commonly referred to as "quotas." The increase will become effective August 1, 2011.

The attached tables provide more information on the change in scup quotas for the remainder of 2011.
