SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

CHANGES TO VESSEL MONITORING SYSTEM (VMS) REQUIREMENTS FOR FISHING YEAR 2011

Dear SkyMate VMS Vessel Owner:

You will be receiving new software for your VMS unit this month directly from SkyMate. A software CD with instructions for loading the new software on your PC will be mailed from SkyMate by **April 12, 2011**. Please load and begin using this new software for any trips you take on or after May 1, 2011.

This letter provides you with specific guidance on how to use your new SkyMate VMS screens to comply with approved regulatory changes that are likely to be effective on May 1, 2011.

There are several amendment and framework adjustment actions to the Northeast regulations that have been approved for implementation on May 1, 2011. There are other regulatory actions under consideration and pending approval after May 1, 2011. As a result, the screens that you view on your SkyMate VMS unit are being updated to include both approved and proposed fishing year 2011 regulatory changes.

REQUIRED VMS SOFTWARE

Your SkyMate VMS unit must be loaded and running the new NMFS-approved software by May 1, 2011. The new software is identified as SkyMate Client software **version 3.936**. After you have successfully loaded your software, you will see “**SkyMate 3.936 Client Software**” appearing in the upper left hand corner of your VMS screen.

Note: Please remember that, anytime your vessel is underway, you must have your PC onboard and running the most current SkyMate VMS software to be fully VMS-compliant with NMFS.

VMS VENDOR SOFTWARE DELIVERY PLAN

SkyMate will mail the new NMFS-approved VMS software from their Toronto, Canada office to the address of their customers on file with SkyMate. LIST OF ALL REQUIRED VMS DECLARATIONS AND FORMS SCREENS

Here is a complete listing of all Northeast VMS screens by Fishery Management Plan. A brief summary of the 2011 changes, if any, are included. Instructions for completing the new and revised SkyMate forms starting May 1, 2011 are provided in **enclosure (1)**.

Multispecies.

- **Multispecies Declaration.** No changes.
- **Multispecies Catch Report.** No longer requires you to enter a ‚zero’ in fields where no fish were kept. Removes ‚windowpane’ flounder species from reporting. Adds instructions about negative reports.
- **Trip Start and End Hail.** Title drops the word ‚Sector’ and the instructions refer to use by groundfish vessels. Trip Start Hail adds a new field ‚Observer/ASM On-Board (Y/N)’. Trip End Hail revises the dealer field to ‚Dealer/Offload location’.
- **Restricted Gear Area Notification.** No changes.
- **Gulf of Maine Cod Trip Limit Exemption.** The form now requires the user to check a box in order to declare their intent and send the form.
- **Gulf of Maine Gillnet Mesh Exemption. NEW FORM.** Required by sector vessels if they intend to fish under the 6” gillnet exemption in the GOM RMA.

Monkfish.

- **Declaration.** No changes.
- **Monkfish Trip Limit Overage DAS Adjustment. NEW FORM.** Required when exceeding the monkfish daily limit by no more than one extra limit and requesting to be charged the appropriate monkfish DAS to account for the extra limit.

Scallop.

- **Scallop Declaration.** Removes the scallop-specific Power Down declaration (LAGC vessels may power down using a new VMS code). Adds ‚Hudson Canyon’ and ‚State Waters Exemption Program’ to LAGC and limited access declaration menus. Removes specific access areas from the RSA menu and adds a generic ‚Scallop Access Area(s)’ declaration. If participating in the State Waters Exemption Program, you may now report through VMS, rather than through the IVR system. Although the Hudson Canyon declaration is included in the menu, this access area remains closed. If Framework 22 is approved, you will be notified of any changes to the access area rotational schedule.
- **Scallop Catch Report.** Revises the scallop catch report based on new reporting requirements proposed in Amendment 15. These instructions require daily catch reporting within the two yellowtail flounder stock areas. New fields include ‚Date Fish Caught’, ‚GB YT’ and ‚SNE/MA YT’ stock area and ‚All Other Fish Kept’. Be aware that these reporting instructions outline requirements that are not yet finalized. Please continue reporting your catch only from access area trips.

- **LAGC Scallop Pre-Landing Notification.** Allows for the reporting of both „Meats’ and „Bushels in-shell’ if the intent is to land both.
- **Scallop Broken Trip Notification.** The instructions are clarified to specify the two situations when the report should be sent.
- **Scallop Access Area Compensation Trip.** No changes.

Herring.

- **Herring Declaration.** No changes.
- **Herring Catch Report. NEW FORM. DO NOT SUBMIT UNTIL NOTIFIED FURTHER.** This report, if/when approved, would require daily reporting by all limited access vessels on a declared herring trip. Please continue to report herring catch through the IVR system until notified otherwise.
- **Herring Pre-Landing Notification.** Instructions are clarified to require reporting only from CAT A/B vessels using mid-water trawl or purse seine gear on a declared herring trip.

SurfClam, Ocean Quahog & Maine Mahogany Quahog. No changes.

Declare Out of Fishery & Power Down.

- **Power Down Declaration.** Adds a new Power Down declaration for use while moored/dockside ONLY by LAGC scallop vessels and authorized groundfish sector vessels IF they do not have more restrictive permits requiring 24/7 reporting.

When you click on “NMFS VMS” on the left side of your SkyMate screen, you will see the view in **Screen 1** below. Note the new “**Forms NE**” tab at the top. This tab will bring you to all Northeast VMS catch and trip notification forms.

Now, let’s take a look at each of the new and revised SkyMate forms. Please note that for all forms, when you’ve filled in all required fields, the „Send’ tab will pop up at the top of the screen which allows you to submit the form to NMFS.

Multispecies Catch Report. Your reporting requirement is determined by whether you are a sector or common pool vessel; whether fishing in a single broad stock area (BSA) or multiple BSAs on the same trip; and whether you're fishing in the US/CA Management Area, under the Regular B-DAS Program, or in a special access program (SAP), as follows:

Vessel Category	Frequency of Report Submission	Multiple BSA Trip	Single BSA Trip	US/CA Management Area, B-DAS, SAP Trip
Sector	Once at the end of the trip	Send all fields except „DATE FISH CAUGHT’ and „STATISTICAL AREA’.	Send VTR serial number only.	Send all fields except „DATE FISH CAUGHT’, and „STATISTICAL AREA’ when the trip is fished in more than one statistical area.
Common Pool	Daily – if fishing in a special management program. Once at the end of the trip – if fishing outside of a special management program and in a single or in multiple BSAs.	Send all fields except „STATISTICAL AREA’ when the trip is fished in more than one statistical area.	Send VTR serial number only.	Send all fields except „STATISTICAL AREA’ when the trip is fished in more than one statistical area.

Multispecies Catch Report

This report is to be used for all groundfish trips, including trips into multiple broad stock areas (BSA), US/Canada Management Area, Regular B-DAS Program, Special Access Programs.

For Multiple BSA Trips: Submit one trip-level report before crossing the VMS demarcation line on return trip.

For Single BSA Trips: Submit only the VTR Serial Number and no other information before crossing the VMS demarcation line on return trip.

For US/CA, B-DAS and/or SAP Trips: For each day of a declared trip, this report must be submitted by 9 AM the following day. Negative reports (0 lb) must be submitted when no fish were caught.

Important: Report species in lbs kept. You are not required to enter a 'zero' in those spaces below in which no fish were kept. VTR serial number must be the same as reported to the dealer. If you use multiple VTR pages this trip, record the serial number from the first VTR page used.

Note: For 'All Fish Kept', include total lbs of all groundfish and non-groundfish.

To send a negative daily report, you only need to fill in the „VTR Serial Number’ field.

Enter your VTR (logbook) serial or page number (up to 14 numeric characters).

Only if required, enter the 3-digit NMFS statistical area where the fish were caught.

These labels refer to the 4 broad stock areas:
 - Gulf of Maine
 - Inshore Georges Bank
 - Offshore Georges Bank
 - Southern New England Mid-Atlantic

Enter only the fields (up to 6 numbers each) in which fish were kept (in lbs).
You do not have to enter a zero in the other fields.

These 4 fields should reflect the total (in lbs) of all fish species kept.

Trip Start Hail and Trip End Hail. In the Trip Start Hail, all fields are required with the exception of the „Estimated Offload’ field. The new „Observer/ASM’ field may be used to determine whether dockside monitoring is required in 2011 and 2012. In the Trip End Hail, all fields are required with the exception of the „Second Offload State’ and „Second Offload Port City’ fields. In the „Dealer/Offload’ field, state either the dealer or the offload location if different than the dealer location.

To begin: Click on the Trip Start Hail.

Enter the estimated arrival in 2-digit month, day, hour & minute (local 24-hour clock).

This field is conditional depending on the trip length (see the instructions for guidance).

Enter up to 14 numeric characters.

Enter the estimated arrival and offload fields in 2-digit month, day, hour & minute (local 24-hour clock).

These fields are conditional; enter the information only if you will conduct a second offload on this trip.

Enter up to 6 numeric characters.

Gulf of Maine Cod Trip Limit Exemption. Previously, you only had to read the form and send it. The only change is to check the box and send it. This form is only required for common pool groundfish trips with possession limits fished outside the U.S./Canada Management Area. See the next page for a view of the multispecies RMAs.

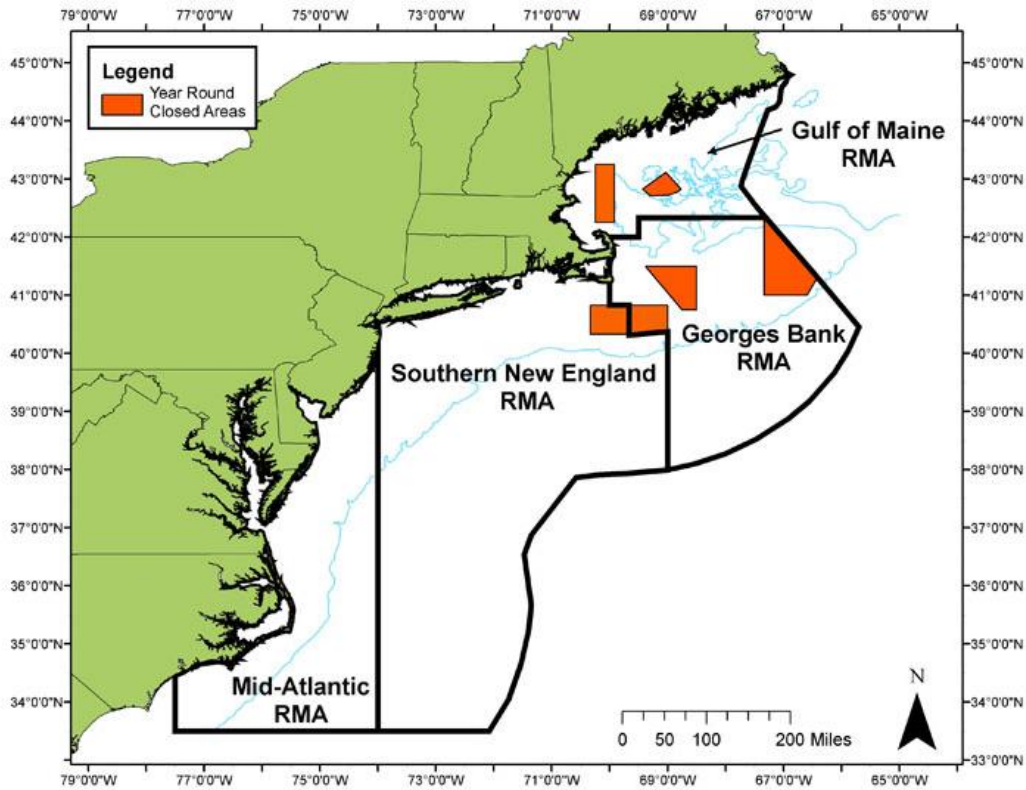
Check this box and click „send’.

Gulf of Maine Cod Trip Limit Exemption

Note: Vessels declaring into the U.S./Canada Management Area exclusively are not required to submit this form.

Check this box prior to leaving port to report that you intend to fish south of the Gulf of Maine Regulated Mesh Area (GOM RMA) and would like to be exempt from the GOM cod trip limit and subject to the Georges Bank (GB) trip limit instead. If you submit this form you will be subject to the GB cod trip limit and can't fish in the GOM RMA for the duration of your trip. Transiting is allowed provided all gear is properly stowed while within the GOM RMA.

Gulf of Maine Gillnet Mesh Exemption. This form is required by groundfish sector vessels only. To declare this NMFS-authorized sector exemption from the Gulf of Maine gear restriction, you must check the box and send the form before leaving port. Refer to the above chart for a view of the GOM Regulated Mesh Area (RMA).

Check this box and hit **.send**.

Gulf of Maine Gillnet Mesh Exemption

Check this box and submit this form prior to leaving port if you are a sector vessel and intend to fish under this exemption using 6 inch mesh gillnets in the Gulf of Maine Regulated Mesh Area.

Monkfish Trip Limit Overage DAS Adjustment. All three fields are required to be filled in before sending the form. The form must be sent before the trip ends (before crossing the VMS demarcation line) so that NMFS automated processes associate the DAS adjustment request with the trip dates. The DAS charge for the trip is automatically adjusted.

First, enter the information in the 2 fields to the right, and then check this box and hit **.send?**

Monkfish Trip Limit Overage DAS Adjustment

Instruction: This form only applies to vessels fishing on a Monkfish Day-at-Sea (DAS) and is required to be sent before the vessel crosses the VMS demarcation line on the return to port. Complete all fields below.

Check this box to report that your vessel has exceeded the applicable Monkfish daily trip limit by no more than one extra limit and you are requesting that your Monkfish DAS allocation be charged to account for the extra one-day trip limit. Your vessel's Monkfish DAS charge will be increased up to the next 24 hour period plus one minute.

Vessel Trip Report (VTR) Serial Number:

Enter up to 14 numeric characters.

Enter arrival information in 2-digit month and day, and 4-digit year.

Scallop Declaration Screen. Remember - you may not declare into a scallop access area until that area is open to fishing. You may declare into the State Waters Exemption Program as of May 1, 2011; if you have both a limited access and LAGC permit, declare into the exemption program under the „Limited Access Permit’ declaration menu. If you’re declaring an RSA trip into one or more scallop access areas open to fishing, you may select „Scallop Access Area(s)’ as of May 1, 2011.

Note: The LAGC scallop power down declaration has been removed. See the ‘Declaration for Other’ screen on the next page).

Note: No changes were made to the Surfclam, Ocean Quahog, Herring or DOF declarations.

Caution: This declaration can only be used by groundfish sector vessels granted a NMFS exemption as well as LAGC scallop vessels IF those vessels do not have more restrictive permits requiring 24/7 VMS reporting. The new VMS Code is: **PWD-PWD-XXXXXX**

Vessels on a NMFS-authorized LOE do not need to send this declaration.

Scallop Catch Report. The scallop catch report form has been updated to reflect changes that would occur if Amendment 15 is approved. However, until you have been notified by NMFS of the approval and implementation of Amendment 15, you are only required to send this daily report when declared into a scallop access area and only the following fields are required: VTR, Scallop Meats Kept, Yellowtail Kept, and Yellowtail Discarded.
