Dear Atlantic Surfclam and/or Ocean Quahog Permit Holder:

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries Service) has issued final fishing quotas for the 2006 and 2007 fishing years for surfclams, ocean quahogs, and Maine ocean quahogs. This final rule modifies the 3-year (2005-2007) quota specifications published in the Federal Register (70 FR 2023) on January 12, 2005, by not increasing the ocean quahog quota in 2006 and again in 2007. The ocean quahog quota will instead remain at the 2005 quota level of 5.333 million bushels. The status quo quota (3.4 million bushels) for the surfclam fishery for 2006 and 2007, as well as the 100,000 Maine bushel quota for the Maine ocean quahog fishery for 2006 and 2007, remain unchanged. In addition, the minimum size limit for surfclams has been suspended for the 2006 fishing year. Below is a summary of the 2006 and 2007 fishing year quotas:

These quotas were published in the Federal Register on December 28, 2005 (70 FR 76715). These quotas will be evaluated in an annual quota recommendation paper prepared by the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council prior to September 1 to determine if the multi-year quota specifications remain appropriate. This letter does not contain all the regulatory provisions that pertain to these fisheries, and so, has no legal force or effect.
