SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

NORTHEAST (NE) MULTISPECIES FRAMEWORK ADJUSTMENT (FW) 42 CHARTER AND PARTY AND RECREATIONAL FISHERY RESTRICTIONS

Dear Permit Holder:

This letter serves to inform you that FW 42 to the NE Multispecies Fishery Management Plan (FMP) has been approved and will become effective on November 22, 2006. FW 42 will continue the charter/party and recreational restrictions that are currently in effect, as implemented by the emergency action on May 1, 2006:

<u>Seasonal GOM Cod Possession Prohibition</u>: Private recreational and charter/party vessels are prohibited from possessing or retaining any cod from the Gulf of Maine (GOM) Regulated Mesh Area (RMA) (see Figure 1 below) from November 1 – March 31.

<u>Minimum Size Restrictions</u>: Private recreational and charter/party vessels are subject to a cod minimum size of 24 inches when fishing in the GOM RMA.

<u>Gear Stowage Requirement</u>: Private recreational and charter/party vessels are allowed to transit the GOM RMA with cod caught from outside this area, provided that all bait and hooks are removed from fishing rods and that all cod are stored in coolers or ice chests. These storage requirements are intended to facilitate the enforceability of these recreational measures.


