Dear Atlantic Sea Scallop Permit Holder,

This letter has been issued to update and remind Atlantic sea scallop permit holders of measures implemented through Framework 18 to the Atlantic Sea Scallop Fishery Management Plan that will become effective January 1, 2007. In addition, this letter announces the extension of the observer program emergency rule through June 11, 2007. This summary is not a substitute for the actual regulations. Elephant Trunk Access Area (ETAA)

The ETAA is scheduled to open January 1, 2007, to both Limited Access and General Category scallop vessels. Please note that the National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) is considering a recent request by the New England Fishery Management Council (Council) for NOAA Fisheries to take interim action to reduce the current ETAA trip allocations, delay the ETAA opening until March 1, 2007, and prohibit vessels from leaving any scallop access area with more than 50 U.S. bushels of in-shell scallops. These Council recommendations were based on concerns raised by the Council's Scallop Plan Development Team that scallop fishing mortality may be too high in 2007. NMFS will notify vessel owners if ETAA measures are changed.

The ETAA will also be closed seasonally to scallop fishing from September 1 - October 31, 2007, effective through 2012. This 2-month closure is intended to provide protection for threatened and endangered sea turtles that may interact with the scallop fishery in the Mid-Atlantic and to reduce small scallop and finfish discard mortality.

<u>2007</u>: 1 trip in Closed Area I Access Area (CAI), 1 trip in the Nantucket Lightship Access Area (NLCA) and 1 trip in ETAA; or 1 trip in CAI and 2 trips in ETAA; or 1 trip in NLCA and 2 trips in ETAA; or 3 trips in ETAA

2007: 1 trip in CAI; or 1 trip in NLCA; or 1 trip in ETAA

Delmarva Scallop Rotational Closed Area

From January 1, 2007, through February 28, 2010, no vessel may fish for, possess, or land, scallops from the Delmarva Closed Area, as defined by the following coordinates:

Point	N. Latitude	W. Longitude

DMV2	38°10'	74°00'
DMV3	37°15'	74°00'
DMV4	37°15'	74°50'
DMV1	38°10'	74°50'

Vessels that have declared a scallop trip on their vessel monitoring system (VMS), or are in possession of scallops, may transit this area after it closes, provided all gear is stowed and unavailable for use. Vessels may fish for other species in the Delmarva Closed Area, but cannot possess scallops, nor declare a scallop trip on their VMS.

Cashes Ledge Closure Area Correction

The Framework 18 Permit Holder Letter (June 27, 2006) incorrectly omitted one of the six coordinates. The coordinates for the Cashes Ledge Closed Area are:
