Dear Federally Permitted Seafood Dealer:

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces the publication of a regulatory amendment implementing changes to the electronic reporting requirements for dealers permitted by the Northeast (NE) Region of NMFS under 50 CFR part 648. This action also makes a minor change to vessel operator permitting requirements. All changes are effective May 1, 2005.

Major Changes

- ➤ Reporting Schedule: all NE federally-permitted seafood dealers must submit electronic purchase reports weekly, by midnight of the first Tuesday following the end of the reporting week.
- ➤ Out-of-Region Purchases: dealers purchasing or receiving fish from a vessel landing outside the NE Region are required to report only those species managed by the NE Region (listed above) and American lobster, to the NE Region.
- Inshore Species: certain inshore species, including bay scallop, blood arc clam, soft clam, razor clam, blood worm, sand worm, blue crab, green crab, hermit crab, Japanese shore crab, spider crab, blue mussel, oyster, and quahog are exempt from Federal reporting requirements. This exemption does not apply to purchases of ocean quahogs (*Arctica islandica*).

Other Measures

- ➤ Purchases of Atlantic bluefin tuna are not required to be reported under 50 CFR part 648, however other Highly Migratory Species reporting requirements still apply.
- ➤ The option to submit reports via phone-line File Transfer Protocol is eliminated.
- Price and disposition information is due within 16 days of the end of the reporting week.
- > Several clarifications to the existing reporting regulations concerning units of measure, cage tag numbers, at-sea receivers, computer acquisition requirements, and annual processor reports.
