## **Small Entity Compliance Guide**

Dear Limited Access Northeast (NE) Multispecies Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that, based on a determination that 1,000 Regular B days-at-sea (DAS) have been used under the Regular B DAS Pilot Program, the National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries Service) is prohibiting the use of Regular B DAS under the Regular B DAS Pilot Program. This measure is effective 0001 hours, October 6, 2005, through the end of the current calendar quarter on October 31, 2005.

- Any vessel that has already declared their intent to fish in the Regular B DAS Pilot Program through their Vessel Monitoring System (VMS), departed on a trip and crossed the demarcation line before October 6, 2005, must either complete its trip under a Regular B DAS by crossing the VMS demarcation line on its return to port, or flip to fishing under a Category A DAS, before 0000 hours local time on October 6, 2005.
- Vessels that have not yet departed on a trip to fish in the Regular B DAS Pilot Program as of 0001 hours, October 6, 2005, may not begin a new trip under this program.
- Effective October 6, 2005, limited access monkfish Category C and D vessels may no longer use a NE multispecies Regular B DAS, instead of a Category A DAS, under the Regular B DAS Pilot Program to target monkfish.

\*The Regular B DAS Pilot Program expires on October 31, 2005, and will not begin again unless renewed by the New England Fishery Management Council and NOAA Fisheries Service. Therefore, vessels issued a limited access NE multispecies DAS permit, including those also issued a limited access monkfish Category C or D permit, may no longer use Regular B DAS under the Regular B DAS Pilot Program, unless implemented at a later date.

This action is being taken based upon available information which indicates that 1,000 Regular B DAS will be used by October 6, 2005. If you have any questions, contact the Sustainable Fisheries Division at 978.281.9315.
