Small Entity Compliance Guide Change in Regulations on Notification Time for Observers

Dear Limited Access Northeast (NE) Multispecies Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you of a change to the regulations implemented by Amendment 13 to the NE Multispecies Fishery Management Plan, on May 1, 2004, and to provide further instructions for observer notification. A regulatory amendment to the final rule that will be effective on June 10, 2004, and will publish in the <u>Federal Register</u> on June 14, 2004, reduces the Observer Program notification time for groundfish DAS vessels prior to departure of a trip into the U.S./Canada Management Area from 5 working days to 72 hours. Therefore:

Groundfish DAS vessel owners who choose to fish in either of the two U.S./Canada Management Areas must provide notice to the National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) of the following at least 72 hours prior to the beginning of any trip that is declared into the U.S./Canada Management Area:

You will receive a confirmation number when you contact the Observer Program, and either an observer will be assigned to you or you will receive a waiver within 72 hours through your Vessel Monitoring System.
