## SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

Dear Scup and/or Black Sea Bass Commercial Vessel Permit Holder:

This letter is to advise you that the National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) is taking action to return unused research set-aside (RSA) allocations to the 2003 scup and black sea bass Total Allowable Landings (TAL).

Two projects that received RSA allocations for 2003 were unable to use significant portions of their allocations. They have requested that these remaining amounts be returned to the TAL for each species. Accordingly, NOAA Fisheries will restore 18,665 pounds of RSA to the overall 2003 scup TAL, and 25,000 pounds of RSA to the overall 2003 black sea bass TAL. The net effect of this action will be a 14,559-lb increase to the scup Winter II commercial quota, a 4,106-lb increase to the scup recreational harvest limit, a 12,250-lb increase to the black sea bass coastwide commercial quota, and a 12,750-lb increase to the black sea bass recreational harvest limit. The increase to the recreational harvest limits will not change any current recreational management measures.
